Preparing for Break

SPRING BREAK

- March 14: Last day of class before spring break

Reminder to families visiting campus: Dogs are not permitted in any residence hall or campus building, except for service dogs.

RESIDENCE HALL CHECKOUT

Before departure, students must have their residence hall rooms inspected. Your room must be clean and clear of garbage and food, and refrigerators must be emptied and unplugged. Please also remove all personal items from your bathrooms before you depart so that our Environmental Services team can sanitize the space. When you check out, you will turn in your room key for safekeeping.

MEDICATION SIGN OUT

Please sign out your medication from Health Services before leaving for break. You can begin this process 24 hours prior to your departure. Allow 15 to 20 minutes for this process. Avoid peak times such as 7 to 8:30 a.m. and 7 to 8:30 p.m.

TRAVEL REMINDERS

As a reminder, all students who requested transportation to the Traverse City airport or bus station will be transported by Interlochen Transportation Staff. Please be sure you have submitted your travel plans with your flight information in the **Education**Community. Students cannot be included in the transportation schedule if we do not know your travel plans. Please call the Travel Team with any questions: 231.276.7373.

Students do not need to worry about printing boarding passes in advance of their travel. Your boarding passes can be printed at the airport, or you may use a digital boarding pass on your phone.

Buses to the airport will load at Mott Rotunda. Don't forget your photo ID, and be sure to check out at your front desk, get travel money from the Business Office, and pick up Interlochen luggage tags from your front desk. If you need to pick up any travel documents for the upcoming break, please pick them up from the travel office as soon as possible (examples: Passport, Birth Certificate, I-20, Vaccination Record, etc.). The travel office is located in the Campus Safety building.

Cultivating Community

PURIM

Sunset on March 13 – nightfall on March 14

Purim is a festive Jewish holiday. The holiday is marked by various traditions including wearing costumes, exchanging gifts, telling stories, using noisemakers called groggers, and indulging in hamantaschen – a triangular pastry with a sweet filling.

Purim celebrates a story of triumph. In the fourth century B.C.E., Haman, prime minister of the Persian Empire, attempted annihilation of the Jewish people, as told in the Biblical book of Esther. The Jews emerged victorious, defeating Haman and those attempting to persecute them. With the victory, the Jews rested and then rejoiced, with the two days celebrated as Purim each year thereafter. On Purim, Jews celebrate the great reversal of fortune of the Jews of Persia and how the day, originally set for their destruction, transformed into one of great joy and celebration. **Learn more here.**

ST. PATRICK'S DAY

Observed on March 17, St. Patrick's Day, honors the patron saint of Ireland, St. Patrick. Born in Roman Britain in the late 4th century, he was kidnapped at the age of 16 and taken to Ireland and was enslaved. After escaping enslavement, he eventually returned to Ireland to spread Christianity. He established monasteries, churches, and schools. Many legends are associated with him, including that he drove the snakes out of Ireland and used the shamrock to explain the Trinity.

Over time, St. Patrick's Day evolved from a solemn religious holiday to a secular holiday of revelry and celebration of all things Irish. The holiday has become a symbol of Irish identity and pride. Today, it is widely recognized as a festive day with people of all backgrounds joining in the festivities to celebrate the rich heritage of Ireland.

- Valid school or government issued photo ID
- A pencil or pen.
- Scratch paper will be provided—do not bring your own.
