COURSE DESCRIPTION

The Advanced Placement Modern European History course deals with the facts, ideas, events and personalities, which have shaped Europe's history from approximately 1450 to the present. The journey through Europe's rich and diverse history takes the student from the tragedy of the Bubonic plague at the end of the Medieval Period to the establishment of contemporary Europe. Within the frameworks of chronological analysis, attention will also be given to unifying themes in intellectual and cultural history, political and diplomatic history, as well as social and economic history. Although the primary purpose of the course is enrichment of the high school experience, students are expected to take the Advanced Placement Modern European History Examination in May.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Students should:

- Identify and apply fundamental historical concepts to local, national and international studies.
- Understand and interpret universal historical themes (such as ideas, institutions, conflict, and technology) in the context of the modern world experience.
- Develop an understanding of causal relationships through analysis of a variety of historical sources relating to the modern era.
- Understand the interaction of humans and the larger environment and the evolving consequences of those interactions.
- Analyze and understand the significance of physical and cultural characteristics of places and European regions.
- Explain and understand the human need for order which leads to conflict and compromise and the attempt to establish authority.

EXPECTATIONS OF STUDENTS
