## Unit 3- Essay: Robber Barons vs. Captains of Industry

**Essay Prompt:** Were the Industrialists of the 19th Century Robber Barons or Captains of Industry/Philanthropists?

## Background:

During the late 19th century, industrialists such as Andrew Carnegie, John D. Rockefeller, Cornelius Vanderbilt, and J.P. Morgan played a pivotal role in shaping America's economy and infrastructure. Their vast fortunes were built through industries like steel, oil, railroads, and banking, revolutionizing the U.S. into a leading industrial power. However, historians and scholars have long debated whether these figures should be seen as \*philanthropists\*—who generously used their wealth to benefit society—or as \*robber barons\*—who exploited workers and manipulated markets for personal gain.

## In your essay, answer the following questions to decide how these men should be remembered:

- 1. **Wealth and Business Practices** How did these men gain their wealth? Were their methods fair, or did they involve unfair tactics like monopolies, poor treatment of workers, or corruption?
- 2. **Impact on America** How did they help build America's economy, industries, and cities? Did these improvements come at the cost of harming workers or smaller businesses?
- 3. **Philanthropy** Many of these men gave away large amounts of money to libraries, schools, and charities. Was this generosity a true desire to help people, or mainly a way to improve their reputations after using harsh business practices?
- 4. **Overall Legacy** In the end, should we remember them as "Captains of Industry" (successful leaders who helped the country), "Robber Barons" (selfish businessmen who hurt others), or a mix of both?

## **Guidelines**:

- Support your arguments with specific examples, including business practices, treatment of workers, contributions to society, and public perception during the Gilded Age.
- Be sure to reference primary and secondary sources where appropriate.
  - The only "copying and pasting" that is acceptable is for directly quoting a source.
    - ALL PARAPHRASING should be YOUR OWN WORDS!!!!
  - Make sure to footnote everything and include the full citation in your bibliography
- Reference at least 2 of the men we've discussed in class: Andrew Carnegie, John D. Rockefeller, J.P. Morgan, or Cornelius Vanderbilt.
