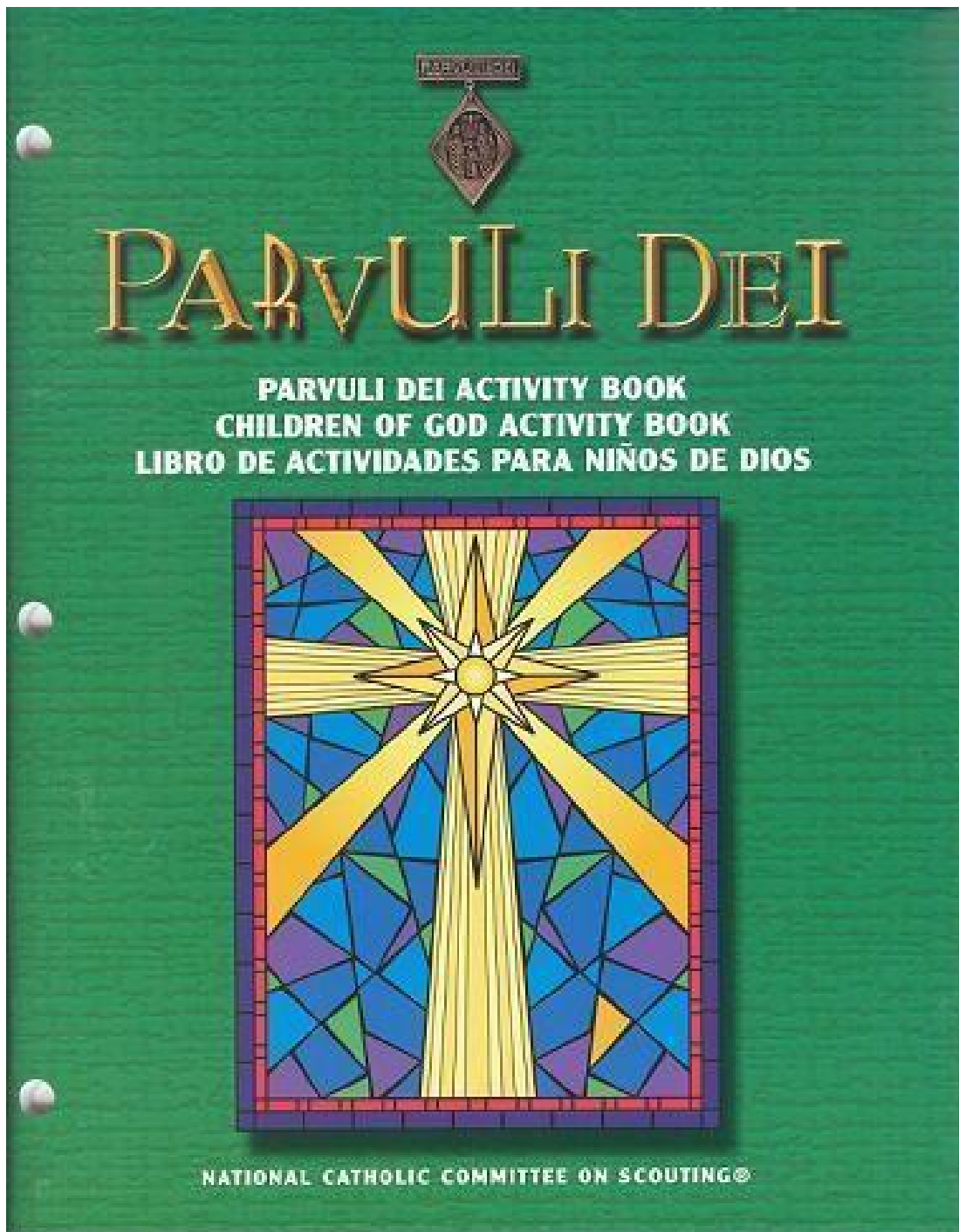

Section One - God and His Creation

Goal: Increase the scout's awareness and appreciation of the world around us created by God

		Retreat?	Home Activity?
1. Learn about creation. A reading from Genesis Ch 1.		X	
Instructions: Ask your mom or dad to help you find the story of creation in the bible and read it together.			
<u>Time Required:</u>	5 minutes		
<u>Preparation:</u>	Have the scripture passage printed out for those without bibles.		
2. Create a picture of the things that God has created.		X	
Instructions: After you've finished reading the story, find and cut out pictures from magazines the things that God has created -- light and darkness, the sun, the moon, the ocean, stars, trees, fruit, birds, animals and people. Or draw then in the space below in your workbook.			
<u>Time Required:</u>	15 minutes		
<u>Preparation:</u>	Have blank 8-1/2 x 11 paper for those that need more room.		
3. How do these gifts help us every day?		X	
Instructions: Make a list of how these gifts from God help us every day. For example, the sun gives us light and keeps us warm; we eat fruit and it tastes good.			
<u>Time Required:</u>	10 minutes		
<u>Preparation:</u>	None. (Use the space provided in the workbook.)		
4. Thank God for His gifts to us		X	
Instructions: Make up a prayer thanking God for all these gifts that He gives to us and write it below. Share it with your family the next time you have dinner together.

5. Share		X	X
Instructions: Draw and cut out (create) a treasure chest for each person in your family - including YOU. When you have finished, gather everyone in your family together and give each one a chest and a pencil or pen. Ask each one to write their name on the chest and give it back to you. In the "chest" (on the back or inside on a scrap of paper) list one or two talents every family member has. Then ask each one to pass his or her chest to the next person. Have them write what they think is special about that person. Keep passing the chests along until everyone has added a "treasure". Then have each person look at their own treasure chest and see how other appreciate them. (Makes a great family discussion.)			
<u>Retreat Adaptation Instructions:</u>	Only PART of this requirement can be completed during the retreat. Use this time to list the family members participating, create the required number of "treasure chests", make the needed number of scrap paper for each person, and finally for the scout to list what's special about each person and place it in the chest.

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Section FOUR - Jesus, His People, and I
