What is Title I? Title I is a federally funded program that is intended to supplement the regular classroom curriculum. Students are provided instruction by highly qualified teachers. The program's goal is to support students, so that every child meets and/or exceeds the state's standards. A variety of teaching methods and materials are used to reinforce curriculum concepts.

What does school-wide Title I mean? A school-wide Title I program ensures the success of students. Everyone has access to the numerous resources and materials purchased with Title I funds. All students are taught by highly qualified staff.
