## Magic Proxy Instructions (Real Gamers Only)

Note: this is gonna look more complicated than it is. It's not that bad once you actually do the process.

Note 2: the shipping is like 20 bucks, so it's more cost effective to order several decks at a time. I usually do 5 commander decks, which works out to be like \$100 total including shipping.

**Step 1)** Visit <u>https://mpcfill.com/</u> and paste your decklist in the text box. It can be as many or as few cards as you like, just have one card per line and make sure to specify how many copies of each you'd like.

- 1b) Click "Submit" and you'll be taken to a new page to select the card art for each of your cards. This is the fun part. There are often dozens of really cool options, some official Wizards art, some done by other artists. You can get gorgeous full-art lands to match your deck's vibe.
- 1c) Here you'll also select the card back you want again, it depends on your preference. There are some that are basically identical to official cards, and that's usually what I go with, but pick what you like! You can leave card quality to S30 Standard Smooth if you want them to feel as close as possible to Wizards card stock, or select S33 Superior Smooth if you want a little bit thicker cards. Ignore the other stock options.
- **1d)** Once you've selected your art, card back, and stock, click "Download All Images." It'll likely open a ton of tabs, don't freak out, they close themselves. Make sure you save all the images to the same folder with nothing else in it.

Step 2) Visit <u>https://www.makeplayingcards.com/</u> and make an account for ease of use.

- 2b) Select the product "design your own game cards (63.5 x 88.9mm)" and from the "size of deck" dropdown select the closest number to the number of cards from your mpcfill list (that exceeds your number). So for example if you're getting one commander deck of 100 cards you'd select "up to 108 cards" in the dropdown. I usually just use the extra slots for staples like Sol Ring, extra lands, or upgrades to existing decks.
- 2c) Click "start your design" and you'll be sent to a new page to select the specifications for your cards. From the four listed options select "different images." Now click the red "upload images" button and select the card art downloaded from mpcfill. You can click "help me autofill images" to automatically add each card to the blank slots. This process will take a little bit, so go get a drink or something. Once they're all added, take a moment to manually add any duplicates you'd like. Mpcfill only downloads one copy of each card art, so if you've got 30 of the same land make sure you manually drag 29 additional ones into the blank slots.

- 2d) Click "next step" and you'll be taken to a page to add text to your cards. You don't need to do this since the text is part of the card art, so just click "next step" again. You'll be taken to a page to add the card back art. From the four listed options, select "same image." Drag the card back art into the blank slot. Click "next step." You'll be taken to a page to add text to the back. You don't need to do this part either, so click "next step" again.
- **2e)** You'll be taken to a page to review your cards. Make sure everything looks good, then add to cart and checkout. You're done!
