### Discussion Questions:

### Practical Applications:

1. Daily Armor Check: Commit to spending time each day "putting on" a specific piece of the armor of God through prayer, scripture meditation, or journaling.
2. Accountability Partners: Pair up with another group member to encourage each other in spiritual disciplines throughout the week.
3. Community Engagement: Identify ways your group can serve together in the community, demonstrating the unity and love of Christ to others.
4. Scripture Memorization: Choose a key verse from Ephesians 6 to memorize as a group over the next week.

5. Prayer Focus: Spend time praying for each other's specific spiritual battles and for the church as a whole to stand firm against the enemy's schemes.

6. Discernment Exercise: Practice identifying lies or deceptions in popular media or culture, and discuss how to counter them with biblical truth.

Closing Reflection:

Take a moment to reflect on areas where you feel vulnerable to the enemy's attacks. Ask God to strengthen you in these areas and to help you fully embrace the victory we have in Christ.
