Introduction

The program aims to facilitate the learning and understanding of SDG implementation in several areas in Indonesia. Within the program, the participants will be able to explore the SDGs implementation particularly about SDGs 1, 2, 4, 8, 12, 13 and 15 in ITS, Surabaya as host university on 17-23 February 2024. Not only learning in classroom settings, activities in host universities also include site visit, sharing and discussion with local government and NPO about the initiatives towards aforementioned SDGs. The main and the first host of this program would be ITS who will lead the pre-onsite program by zoom and become the host of the first week of the program. In addition to that, participants will get the opportunity to know more about SDGs implementation in co-host institutions including Universitas Semarang, Universitas Islam Riau, and Institut Teknologi dan Bisnis Nobel Indonesia in Makassar in the second week of the program. Between 24-29 February 2024, the participants will be divided into several groups and dispatched to the co-host institutions. Activities in co-host universities will broaden participant's insight about the SDGs implementation and challenges in different areas in Indonesia. At the end of the program, participants are expected to gain a comprehensive understanding of the SDGs, develop practical skills for their implementation, and build a network of like-minded individuals and organizations committed to sustainable development in Indonesia. The program aims to contribute to the overall progress of SDG implementation in the country, fostering positive change, and promoting a more sustainable and equitable future for all Indonesians.











Host Institutions:

Arrival & Departure

Participants are strongly advised to arrive in Juanda International Airport, Surabaya. Juanda International Airport (Indonesian: Bandara Udara Internasional Juanda) is an international airport located in Sidoarjo, a neighboring city near Surabaya, East Java. It is located approximately 20 km from the city center of Surabaya. If there is no direct flight to Juanda International Airport from your country, you may transit first at Soekarno-Hatta International Airport, Cengkareng, Jakarta or Ngurah Rai International Airport, Denpasar, Bali. Then, you could take a domestic flight from Jakarta or Denpasar to Surabaya.









^{*}According to ITS', Universitas Semarang', Universitas Islam Riau', Institut Teknologi & Bisnis Nobel Indonesia' academic regulation, 1 credit consists of 50-minute lectures x 16 sessions = 13,3 hours. Hence, 54 hours is equivalent to 4 credits.







There are two airport terminals in Juanda International Airport, Terminal 1 and Terminal 2. They are located near each other but different locations for the entrance. If you take an international flight to Surabaya, you will land at Terminal 2, but if you take a domestic flight to Surabaya, you will probably land at Terminal

Please arrive in Surabaya on 17 Feb 2024. You should not worry about your access to the lodging, because we provide all accommodation including pick up service at the airport. Please make sure to confirm your arrival details to us.











Facilities & Benefit

All students from UMAP members (except Indonesian nationality) could register in this program through USCO in UMAP website and nomination from the home university is mandatory. The program fee is waived for all selected students. However, you need to be responsible with your return flight ticket, dinner, visa fees (if any), travel insurance and other personal expenses. During the program, all participants will stay in Campus Guest House and Hotel. The committee also provides pick up arrangements on Feb 17 in Surabaya and drop off service on Feb 23 in Semarang, Riau, and Makassar. The participants who completed the program are entitled to receive certificates of participation from ITS, Universitas Semarang, Universitas Islam Riau, Institut Teknologi & Bisnis Nobel Indonesia.

Financial Information

During this program, you should also bring extra money. Indonesia mainly accept Indonesian Rupiah (IDR) as payment. Should you have to exchange money after your arrival, you may also need to bring money in US Dollar (USD). In Surabaya and Semarang, many big shops accept visa and mastercard for payment.

Rough estimation for daily needs are:

Mineral Water 600ml : Rp 4,000.00 per Bottle

Snacks : Rp 5,000.00 – Rp 20,000.00 each

Toiletries : RP 15,000.00 – RP 30,000.00 each

Sim Card : Rp 50,000.00 – Rp.100,000.00 each

Climate and Weather

Indonesia is a tropical country with 2 seasons only. The humidity level is high, especially during December to March. We suggest you bring an umbrella or a raincoat along. Surabaya and Semarang is also known for its hot temperature up to 36° Celcius. When it rains, the temperature drops into around 23° – 25° Celcius.

<u>Outfit</u>

Appropriate clothing during the program consists of common appropriate working outfit including collar shirt, blouse over full-length jeans and trousers and a pair of shoes. Please make sure that you wear a collared outfit in formal session during this program due to our regulation in our universities. During the rainy season, a jumper/sweater/pullover or sweat shirt will be sufficient. You may not need to bring too many personal items for your necessities in Indonesia. ITS, Universitas Semarang, Universitas Islam Riau, Institut Teknologi & Bisnis Nobel Indonesia is located near malls and shopping centers which provide daily needs, clothing and electronics equipment. Please use decent cloth and pants (no vulgar cloth and hot pan).

Visa Arrangement & Arrival Info

As per stated 6 April 2022, International Visitor from nine ASEAN countries can enter Indonesia with visa-free visits, while students from 43 countries are currently allowed to apply for a Visa on Arrival (VoA) for a 30 days-length stay in Indonesia. The fee for getting the VoA is IDR 500.000 and you may arrange this visa at the arrival's airport. The immigration will ask you to show your return ticket in order to get a VoA/ASEAN Free Visa. The visa fees could only be paid in IDR currency. So we suggest to prepare IDR from your country in cash.

Students from countries that are not listed above, must apply for an online visa through ITS at least 3 weeks before the arrival date. The fees for this visa is IDR 2.000.000,-

As per 18 July 2022, Indonesia has renewed the entry regulation to enter Indonesia. International visitor can enter Indonesia without quarantine and without show PCR, need to prepare the following documents:

- 3rd dose of Vaccination certificate (print out and digital). Please kindly provide the certificate in english and your origin language for print out certificate of vaccination. However you need to input your digital certificate first to our Government website at least 10 days before your arrival. Please kindly go to this website and upload all your certificate vaccination here 2 https://vaksinln.dto.kemkes.go.id/sign/in
- If you have got Covid-19 positive, please kindly provide a recovery letter which can show that you have already recovered from Covid-19 at least 30 Days before your arrival.
- Please download the application of "Pedulilindungi" from playstore and please kindly fill
 at e-hac section in before your arrival in Indonesia. We will conduct zoom meeting and
 also create Whatsapp group to assist you for this matter.
- If you have a special case where you do not receive vaccination, you need to show a letter from the Government Hospital/Public Hospital about your situation.





Regarding the Covid protocols in the airport, there are two schemes that you need to be aware of:

 After the temperature is checked, for those who do not have Covid-19 symptoms and below 37,5 Celcius, the officer will only ask for your documents, and they will allow you to continue your journey.











- 2. If your body temperature is higher than 37,5 Celcius. Here are the steps that you need to follow:
 - You need to take PCR Test in the Airport in Indonesia
 - You need to wait in a hotel at least one day until you get a negative result test.
 However, you need to pay for the Hotel & PCR Test on your own.

Due to the condition above, we would like to suggest for participants who transit/change plans in Jakarta/Denpasar-Bali, to prepare a minimum of 3 hours before your next flight to Surabaya.
