

Amendments to the Revised Senate Procedures Act of 2023

Article 1, Changes to the classifications of motions:

§1. Impeachments and Presidential Appointments are to be removed from the list of privileged motions.

§2. A fourth type of motion will be added to part 1 of article 1 of the Revised Senate Procedures Act.

§2.1. This type of motion will be referred to as “Necessary Motions.”

§3. Necessary motions will include three types of motions.

§3.1. These motions are impeachments, presidential appointments, and the removal of the chief archivist.

Article 2, Changes to the Procedures of Motions:

§1. The following will be added to part 2 of article 1 of the revised senate procedures act:

§3. Necessary motions are votes that must happen quickly, but require a number of additional steps before they can be done in a proper manner.

§4. After a member of the senate requests an impeachment, a 48 hour special investigation will begin following the rules for special investigations listed in article 5 of this act.

§4.1. This investigation may be ended early with a simple majority vote.

§5. After this investigation has ended, a 24 hour hearing will begin in a post in the senate floor channel of the discord server.

§5.1. The person being impeached should have the ability to speak in that post and respond to questions.

§5.2. This hearing may be ended early with a simple majority vote.

§6. After the investigation and the hearing, the speaker will hold a vote to impeach the official. This vote will last for 24 hours.

§7. When the President makes an appointment, the speaker will begin a hearing that will last for 24 hours.

§7.1. The person being appointed by the president will be requested to answer a series of questions asked by the senate in a post in the senate floor discord channel, and the appointee should have the ability to answer these questions.

§7.2. This hearing may be ended early with a simple majority vote.

§8. After the hearing, the senate will hold a vote on whether or not they should confirm the appointed person.

§8.1. This vote will last for 24 hours.

§9. When the president requests permission to fire the Chief Archivist, the Senate will hold a 24 hour hearing in a post in the senate floor channel on the discord server.

§9.1. The Chief Archivist should be able to respond to questions asked as part of this hearing.

§9.2. This hearing may be ended early by a simple majority vote.

§10. After this hearing has ended, the speaker will hold a 24 hour vote to fire the Chief Archivist.”
