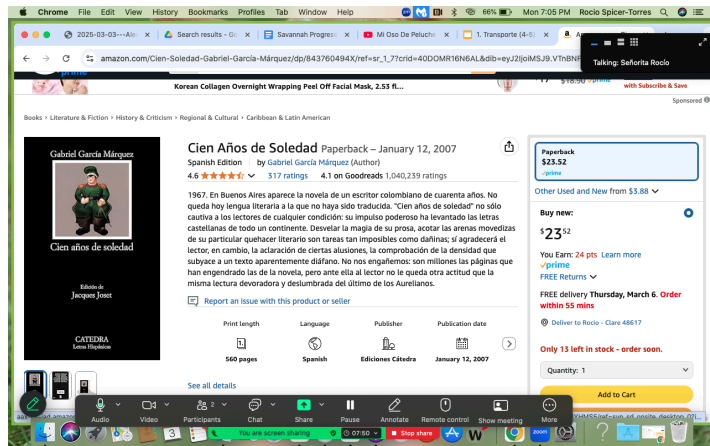
2/10/2025
