



Section 1116 Parent and Family Engagement Planning Document

ESSA Section 1116 describes this as “Policy”. In Michigan, policy is put in place by school boards. As such, this has been interpreted as a “Plan”. The section references will refer to the Policy, while the Layman’s Description box will always refer to the Plan.

The Parent and Family Engagement Plan is broken into four sections: POLICY INVOLVEMENT, SHARED RESPONSIBILITIES, BUILDING CAPACITY, and ACCESSIBILITY.
