Both, either and neither

Use:

1) Both

Both means two of two things.

I have two cats. I like both of them.

2) Neither

Neither means not one or the other of two things. Жоден означає ні одне, ні інше з двох речей.

Neither of my cats is grey.

Remember to use a singular verb after neither.

Neither of the dogs are dangerous. => **Neither of the dogs is dangerous.**

3) Either

Either means one or the other. Або означає те чи інше.

There are two cakes. Please have one. You can have either one.

Form:

1) You can use both, neither and either **directly before a noun**. безпосередньо перед іменником.

Both supermarkets are good.

Neither supermarket sells electrical goods.

We can go to either supermarket, I don't mind.

2) Both, neither and either are often used with 'of'. But you must always use **a determiner** визначник (the, my, these, those, his etc) before the noun.

Both of children like chocolate cake. => **Both of the children like chocolate cake.**

However, you don't have to use of with both.

Both of the children like chocolate cake.

Both children like chocolate cake.

3) You can use both, neither and either+ of + object pronoun(you, them, us).

Both of them wore white dresses.

Neither of us was late.

Have either of you got a pen?

4) You can use **both ... and ...; neither ... nor ..., and either ... or ...**

Examples:

Both James and Diana work here.

Neither James nor Diana works here.

You can ask either James or Diana.
