JOINT BILL TO ESTABLISH A COMMITTEE ON ETHICAL SPENDING

ACTION REQUESTED: Majority Vote of the Association Legislative Bodies

STATUS: 4 November 2024, 13-0-2 Passed (GSC); 6 November 2024, 10-0-2 Passed (UGS)

WHEREAS the legislative bodies of the Association are charged with the sound use and disbursement of student funds;¹

WHEREAS the Association, as a financial steward, should engage in principled funding and investment practices to the extent possible, and commit student funds to ethical purposes;

WHEREAS the Association should enhance procedures in furtherance of that commitment;

WHEREAS Article II, Section 2 of the Joint By-Laws empowers the Association legislative bodies to "create joint legislative committees for specific purposes, [and] to vest in them all appropriate powers of the [UGS] and GSC";

WHEREAS the legislative bodies shall jointly have the power "to determine [the Committee] composition, and to designate the chair";²

WHEREAS "all substantive actions of a joint legislative committee shall take the form of recommendations" to the relevant legislative body;³

THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED BY THE ASSU LEGISLATIVE BODIES:

THAT a Joint Committee on Ethical Spending (hereafter referred to as "the Committee") be established to incorporate ethical and social considerations into the fiduciary responsibilities of the Association; and

THAT the Committee operate in accordance with the conditions of the following <u>charter</u>.
