Course Name: Senior Personal Finance and Citizenship - Academic

Students will explore the basic concepts of personal finance such as income, interest, credit, budgeting, investments and more. Students will also explore the rights and duties of US citizenship including the pathways to citizenship, paying taxes, voting and election processes and participating in civil discussion around many current event topics.

The academic course is designed for students who are reading close to or at grade level. Students in this course will work on advancing basic skills to meet standards. Students are working towards learning independently. The objective is to prepare students for a range of post-secondary options.
