Unfortunately, Bethune's business records, plans, and drawings do not survive. According to Madeleine B. Stern (*We the Women*, 1963, p. 324), the Bethune office items were bequeathed by Robert A. Bethune, who died a few years after Louise, to William L. Fuchs, their business partner. Mr. Fuchs died in 1930. Margaret Fuchs, William's daughter, told Stern that the office records "have long since been disposed of."

Lafayette Hotel Business Records, 1900-1975

Collection does not include architectural plans or drawings or guest registers. The only Bethune material appears below **in bold**.

Box one includes: Record book, including by-laws of the corporation, June 11, 1900, articles of incorporation, and record of stockholders meetings, June 11 - November 5, 1900; Letter from Duparquet Huot & Moneuse Co., New York to C.R. Eldrige, Lafayette Hotel dated April 6, 1910, re specifications and estimate for installing cooking apparatus; Letter from City Trust Co. to Lafayette Hotel Company dated March 2, 1917, re bond coupons; Proxies for 1942 annual meeting; notice of 1943 annual meeting; List of Officers from 1948; List of stockholders, undated; minutes of executive committee and report of the secretary from 1948; Proposals for laundry equipment from the Troy Laundry Machinery co. and the American Laundry Machinery Manufacturing Co., dated 1910; Specifications for cooking apparatus and equipment by Bethune, Bethune & Fuchs, dated March 15 and April 12, 1910; Specifications by Esenwein & Johnson for plumbing in old part of building, dated November 24, 1915 and for the new ball room dated January 1, 1916; Contract between Dark & Company and Charles H. Everitt for two separate lines of new bathrooms dated December 17, 1917; Sheet of bond coupons from 1912 and assignment of mortgage bonds by Mary D. Yates from 1948; Volume of stock certificates, June 3, 1904-June 7, 1937; and a Stock book for June 3, 1904 - January 4, 1920.

Box two includes: a general ledger including income, rooms, restaurant, bar, barber shop, tailor shop, laundry, general expenses, heat, light & power, maintenance, miscellaneous and fixed charges; and a journal of financial transactions, December 2, 1939 - December 31, 1942.

Collection also has an oversize volume of Accounts Receivable dated March 1, 1969 - May 31, 1975.
