Internship Responsibilities:

- Washington, DC Legislative Interns: Assist with constituent correspondence, answer calls from Delawareans, research legislative issues, attend committee hearings, provide Capitol tours, and support the legislative staff.
- Washington, DC Press and Digital Interns: Monitor media coverage, assist with press releases, prepare for interviews and press conferences, and help create digital and social media content.
- Delaware Office Interns: Work closely with staff across the state, develop an understanding of local issues and constituent needs, and assist with constituent communications.

Application Requirements:

Applicants must create an applicant account and complete the online questionnaire. Required application materials include:

- Cover letter
- Resume
- Letter of recommendation
- Unofficial transcript

All documents should be submitted in PDF format.
