 CSF Fall Semester Membership Worksheet | Chapter #512

TO QUALIFY FOR CSF MEMBERSHIP, FOLLOW THESE GUIDELINES:

1. You must earn a MINIMUM of 10 points from last semester's grades (Spring, 2022).
 - a. The first 4 points MUST be from LIST I unless you are a senior applying in February or June
 - b. The first 7 points (including the 4 points earned from LIST I) must be from LISTS I & II
 - c. The remaining points may come from any LIST (I, II, or III)
2. You cannot use more than 5 courses to qualify and SUMMER SCHOOL NEVER COUNTS - even summer classes taken at COS.
3. No CSF points are awarded for PE, courses taken in lieu of PE, subjects repeated to improve a grade, courses involving clerking and office aide/teaching assistant, courses taken on a pass/fail basis, and summer school courses.
4. CSF points are granted as follows:

An "A" = 3 CSF Points

A "B" - 1 CSF Point

A "C" = 0 CSF Points

- a. A grade of a D or F in ANY course, even one you cannot use to qualify, DISQUALIFIES you from membership for the semester in which the D or F was earned.
 - b. ONE additional point shall be granted for a grade of an A or B in an AP, IB, or Honors course, up to a maximum of TWO such points per semester.
 - c. **There are no additional points taken for ANY college courses.**
6. Also remember:
- a. Semester membership is based on the previous semester
 - b. You must reapply each semester during membership drive week
 - c. You must qualify for **four of your six eligible semesters** to be a lifetime member. Eligible semesters are 10th-12th grade, with a requirement of qualifying for one semester in your senior year.
 - d. Consult the course list on the next page to determine eligibility.

Requirements for Life Membership:

Life membership (Sealbearer status) is earned by students who have been members of CSF four of the six semesters based on grades earned during 10th, 11th, & 12th grades. One of the six semesters must be in the senior year to qualify for lifetime. According to the CSF bylaws, Life Members (Sealbearers) earn the following 3 recognitions: 1) the embossed gold seal on the diploma, 2) Life member noted on the high school transcript, and 3) CSF life membership pin. Redwood High School also gives special recognition (special certificate & CSF patch) to 100% lifetime members.
