Buffalo Orphan Asylum: Index and Guide




The Buffalo Orphan Asylum (BOA) was founded in 1836 and incorporated in 1837 by women from a dozen Protestant churches. It was nondenominational and admitted children from all backgrounds, from Buffalo, NY and the surrounding western New York region.

In 1939, the Asylum discontinued housing children and closed its facilities. Its endowment was placed in a trust, and the Children's Foundation of Erie County was charged with distributing those funds to child-centered charities, most notably the Adoption Bureau of the Children's Aid Society.

The BOA records, including 52 bound volumes, were donated to us in 1982. Included in the donation were typed or hand-written index cards for **some** of the children served, those named in volumes dated about **1882 to 1939**, as seen in <u>Table 1</u> below. There are about 15,000 cards in this index. Scroll to <u>Table 2</u> to dig into the cards.

The 6-7 notation means that John E. Smith is listed in volume 6, page 7. No further biographical information appears on these cards.

Our staff are unable to offer look-ups in the unindexed volumes. They can be seen by appointment by you or a researcher you hire.

Vol. 1 has been transcribed into an online spreadsheet. Volume 2 is underway.

We assume that any name changes that occurred after children left the Asylum are not reflected in the Asylum's records.
