SUBJECT + VERB

<u>I love coffee</u> <u>I drink it every day</u>. - **RUN-ON SENTENCE** -> WRONG I love coffee, I drink it every day. - **COMMA SPLICE** -> WRONG

I love coffee. I drink it every day. - Correct

I love coffee, so / and I drink it every day. - **Compound** (CORRECT)

One independent clause/sentence, SO (conjunctions: FANBOYS -> FOR, AND, NOR, BUT, OR, YET, SO) + another independent sentence.

I love coffee; therefore, I drink it every day. - therefore = that's why

As / Because / Since I love coffee, I drink it every day. - Complex sentence (CORRECT)

I drink coffee every day because I love it. - CORRECT

As = Since = Because

Wrong: I'll stay at home today. Because I'm sick.

Right: I'll stay at home because I'm sick. (it should be one complex sentence)

Because I'm sick, I'll stay at home. (OK)
