Specifically looking for curriculum directors, building principals, teachers to join the department on some calls and provide feedback on the rubrics. Complete this survey if you are interested in participating. • Mathematics <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Statewide partnership with Zearn - focused on middle students, but the free license for K-5 has also been made available currently for districts that opt in ○ Upcoming statewide webinars to expand educators' understanding of the Ohio Learning Standards for Mathematics and the Standards for Mathematical Practice with Better Lesson. This is a two part webinar series to support educators and foster mathematical discourse and language routines. Registration is available on the website, along with recordings of past webinars. • ESC Collaborations <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ 34 ESC math specialists across the state <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Currently working with Better Lesson on learning walks visiting district partners ■ Receiving coaching from Better Lesson along with district administrators ■ Helping districts with HQIM math adoption and implementation ■ ESC leads are learning how to replicate the process with districts ■ Have added several more districts this year, with 20 ESCs participating ○ 68 HQIM specialists across the state <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Some overlap with math specialists and HQIM leads ■ Starting training this semester with Instruction Partners ■ Involved with Communities of Practice ■ Created tools for everyone to use on HQIM adoption and implementation - available beginning in February ■ Assisting with content area rubrics ○ Regional Planning <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Leads across the state help facilitate the work that's happening in each region with the HQIM specialists. Each lead will have a one on one coaching session with EdReports to dig into work happening across the state. ■ Have some funding available through the HQIM grant with their innovative impact grant. A few ESCs have already applied. Funds are available for districts going through adoptions who need help with sub costs or stipends for staff. ■ Looking at regional needs. Will meet with regional leads to discuss feedback from each region on what would be helpful to fund from the grant. ○ Lessons learned |
