Abstract

Write the abstract in English only. The abstract must be 150-250 words and written in one paragraph. It should clearly summarize: (1) the research background or gap, (2) the objective of the study, (3) the method, data, sample, or analytical approach, (4) the main findings, and (5) the contribution or implication of the findings. The abstract must not contain citations, tables, figures, equations, footnotes, or unexplained abbreviations.

Use 3-5 keywords, separated by semicolons. Keywords should represent the core concepts of the article and help indexing services identify the manuscript.

Language	English is mandatory for the entire manuscript. Authors are responsible for grammar, academic style, clarity, and consistency of terminology.
Article type	Original research article, conceptual article, systematic literature review, bibliometric study, case study, or other scholarly article relevant to the journal focus and scope.
Length	Recommended length: 5,000-7,000 words, including tables and references. Longer manuscripts may be



	considered when justified by method or data complexity.
Paper size and margins	A4 paper; margins 2.5 cm on all sides.
Font and spacing	Times New Roman 12 pt; 1.15 line spacing; justified alignment; single column format.
Originality	The manuscript must be original, unpublished, and not under consideration by another journal. Similarity should be kept within the journal policy threshold.
References	Use APA 7th edition. Reference management software such as Mendeley, Zotero, or EndNote is strongly recommended.
Research ethics	Articles involving human participants, interviews, surveys, institutional data, or sensitive data must explain informed consent, confidentiality, and ethical considerations.

1. Introduction

The introduction must explain the research context, urgency, and relevance to the field of Islamic economics, Islamic finance, sharia business, halal industry, Islamic accounting, Islamic banking, or other areas within the journal scope. Authors should present the problem clearly and support it with current data, empirical facts, policy issues, or scholarly debates.

The introduction should include a clear research gap. The gap may be theoretical, empirical, methodological, contextual, geographical, institutional, or policy-based. Authors must avoid writing only a general background without showing what is still unknown or insufficiently explained by previous studies.

At the end of the introduction, state the research objective, research question(s), and contribution of the study. The contribution may relate to theory development, empirical evidence, policy relevance, methodological novelty, or practical implications for Islamic economic institutions and society.

2. Literature Review and Hypothesis Development / Conceptual Framework

This section reviews relevant theories, concepts, and previous studies. Authors should not merely define terms; they must explain how the theory is connected to the research problem, variables, propositions, or analytical framework.

Previous studies should preferably include recent publications from the last five years, especially articles indexed in reputable databases. Authors must compare earlier findings and explain how the present article differs from or extends previous research.

For quantitative research, this section may include hypothesis development. Each hypothesis should be supported by theory and empirical evidence. For qualitative or conceptual research, this section may present propositions, conceptual arguments, or an analytical framework.



3. Research Method

This section must be written in sufficient detail so that the research process can be understood and evaluated by readers and reviewers. The method should be consistent with the research objective and type of data used.

For quantitative research, explain the research design, population, sample, sampling technique, variables, operational definitions, data sources, measurement, model specification, and analysis technique. Include equations when relevant.

For qualitative research, explain the research approach, research site, informants or participants, data collection technique, data validation strategy, and data analysis stages. Explain how credibility, transferability, dependability, or confirmability is maintained.

For literature review, systematic review, or bibliometric articles, explain the database, search keywords, inclusion and exclusion criteria, period of analysis, screening process, number of documents, software used, and analytical categories.

4. Results

This section presents the research findings objectively and systematically. Results may be presented in narrative form, tables, figures, diagrams, or statistical output summaries. Avoid repeating all numbers from tables in the text; emphasize the most important findings.

Tables and figures must be readable, numbered consecutively, and referred to in the text before they appear. The title of a table is placed above the table, while the title of a figure is placed below the figure. Use English titles and notes.

5. Discussion

The discussion must interpret the findings, not merely restate the results. Authors should explain why the findings occur, how they relate to theory, whether they support or contradict previous studies, and what they imply for Islamic economics or related fields.

Discussion should be analytical and critical. When findings are insignificant, contradictory, or unexpected, authors should provide a reasoned explanation based on context, theory, data characteristics, or methodological limitations.

6. Conclusion

The conclusion should answer the research objective directly and summarize the most important findings. Do not introduce new data, new references, or new arguments in this section.

The conclusion may also include theoretical implications, policy implications, practical implications, limitations of the study, and recommendations for future research. Recommendations must be relevant to the findings and should not be too broad or unrelated.



Acknowledgment (Optional)

Authors may acknowledge funding institutions, research grants, institutions, individuals, or organizations that supported the research. Do not include individuals who meet the criteria for authorship in this section.

Author Contributions

Specify each author's contribution, for example: conceptualization, methodology, data collection, data analysis, writing-original draft, writing-review and editing, supervision, and funding acquisition.

Conflict of Interest Statement

Authors must declare whether there is any conflict of interest. Example: The authors declare that there is no conflict of interest regarding the publication of this article.

Funding Statement (If Any)

If the research is funded, mention the funding agency, grant number, and project title. If not funded, write: This research received no specific grant from any funding agency in the public, commercial, or not-for-profit sectors.

Data Availability Statement (If Applicable)

Explain whether the data are available, restricted, or confidential. For example: The data supporting the findings of this study are available from the corresponding author upon reasonable request.

References

References must follow APA 7th edition. Ensure that every citation in the text appears in the reference list and every reference in the list is cited in the text. References should be dominated by recent and relevant scholarly sources.

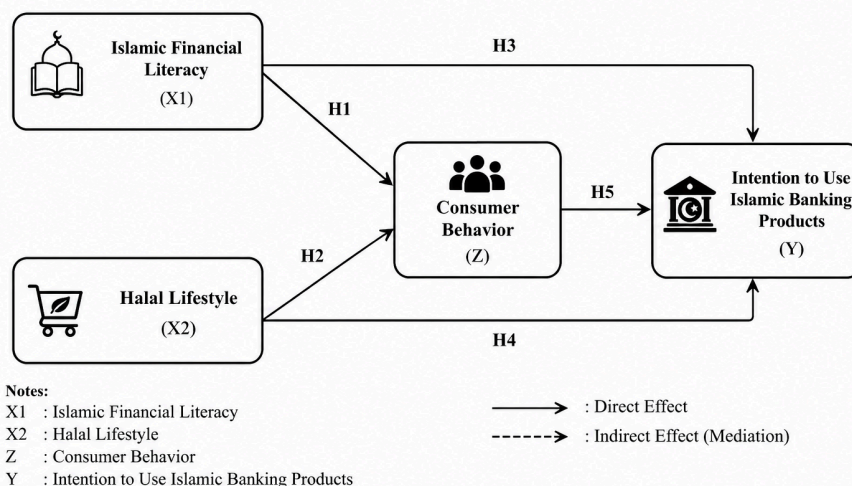

- Tables and figures are numbered, titled, cited in the text, and editable.
- The discussion interprets findings using theory and previous studies.
- The conclusion answers the research objective and includes relevant implications.
- All citations and references follow APA 7th edition.
- The manuscript has been checked for grammar, plagiarism, and reference completeness.
- The manuscript is submitted through the official journal website.
