1. (a) Athena is the Greek goddess of wisdom, war, strategy, heroism, courage, industry, handicraft, and cities
 - i. Aphrodite is the ancient Greek goddess of sexual love and beauty.
 - ii. Calypso was a nymph who lived on the island of Ogygia, where, according to Homer's Odyssey, she detained Odysseus for seven years.
 - iii. Gaia is the personification of the Earth.
 - iv. Nike was a goddess who personified victory in art, music, war, and athletics etc.
2. (d) Die-er. All living things die. Thus, dying is not used as a feature in the definition of an animal. With few exceptions, animals do eat, move, sexually reproduce and are multicellular.
3. (c) Categorical imperative.
