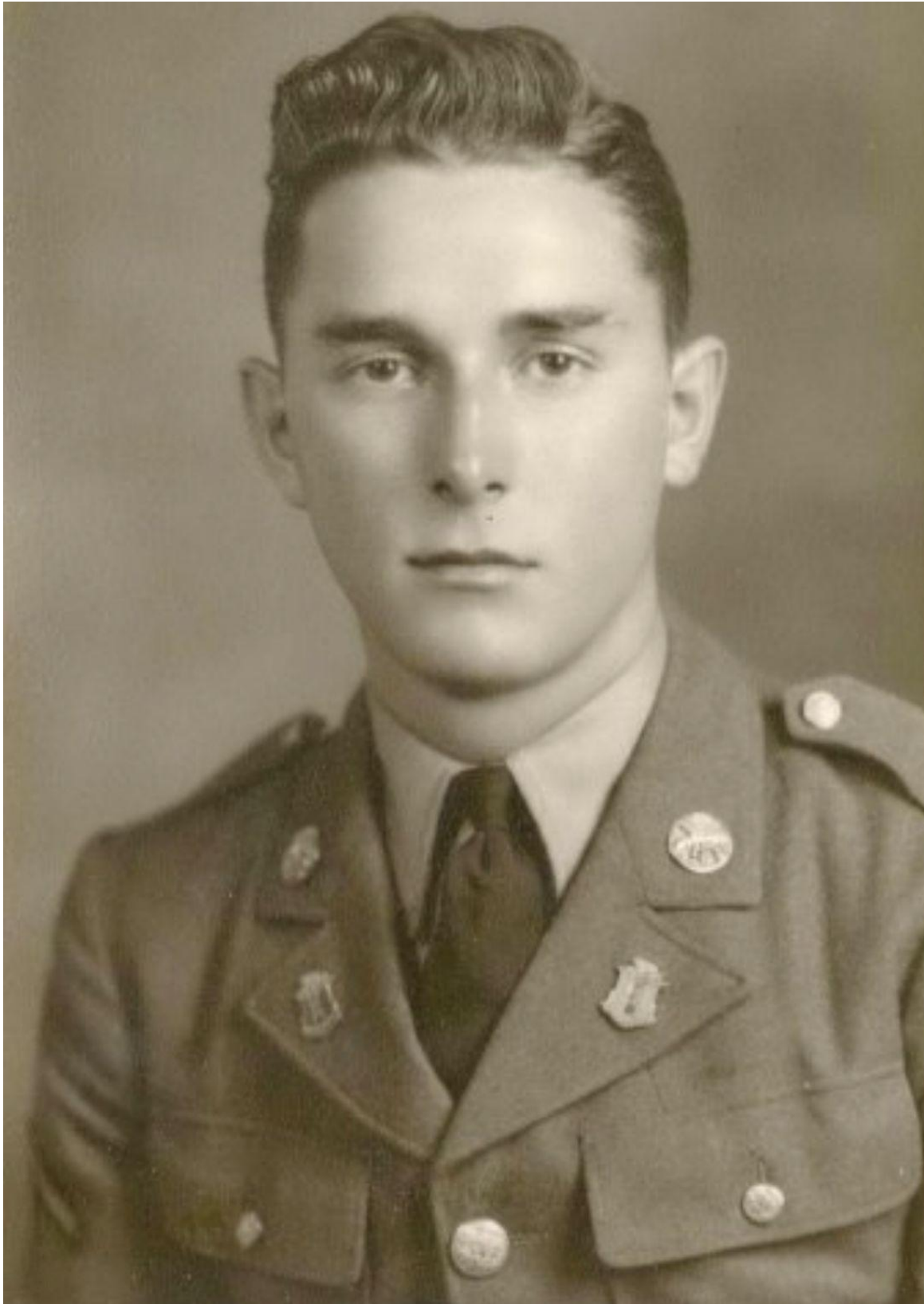


CPL Edward W. DuVall

Another Oshkosh member of the familiar 32nd division which included members of the national guards which left Oshkosh four years ago, Corp. Edward Duvall, 655 Elmwood avenue, with a machine gun company was injured in the Buna campaign on New Guinea in December, 1942. He was taken to Australia soon after that and had remained in that country until he was returned to the states last week.

Edward W. DuVall

Edward W. DuVall, 45, of 1537 W. Fifth Ave., died today at 8:15 a.m. at Mercy Hospital. He had been hospitalized two days.

He was born in Oshkosh on June 21, 1922, son of Byron and Frances DuVall, and was married here to Miss Jane Babler on Oct. 4, 1947.

Mr. DuVall operated a retail grocery store on McKinley Street. He served with the Army during World War II, and was a member of St. Peter Catholic Church.

Cpl. Edward DuVall, son of Mr. and Mrs. Byron DuVall 655 Elmwood avenue, was awarded the purple heart at ceremonies held at William Beaumont General hospital, El Paso, Tex., where he is now stationed. Corporal DuVall left with the 32nd division and was stationed first in Australia and then participated in the Buna Mission campaign and was wounded during the engagement on Dec. 30, 1942. He was stationed in Australia following his recovery until October, 1944, when he was returned to this country. After spending a furlough with his parents, he was assigned to his present station. He has written his parents he expects a furlough within a few weeks.
