Edward W. DuVall, 45, of 1537 W. Fifth Ave., died today at 8:15 a.m. at Mercy Hospital. He had been hospitalized two days.

He was born in Oshkosh on June 21, 1922, son of Byron and Frances DuVall, and was married here to Miss Jane Babler

on Oct. 4, 1947.

Mr. DuVall operated a retail grocery store on McKinley Street. He served with the Army during World War II, and was a member of St. Peter Catholic Church.

Cpl. Edward DuVall, son of Mr. and Mrs. Byron DuVall 655 Elmwood avenue, was awarded the purple heart at ceremonies held at William Beaumont General hospital, El Paso, Tex., where he is now stationed. Corporal DuVall left with the 32nd division and was stationed first in Australia and then participated in the Buna Mission campaign and wounded during the engagement on Dec. 30, 1942. He was stationed in Australia following his recovery until October, 1944, when he was returned to this country. After spending a furlough with his parents, he was assigned to his present station. He has written his parents he expects a furlough within a few weeks.
