Opening Words

Gospel Reading

<u>Luke 18:1-8</u> The Parable of the Persistent Widow (NIV) Photo Reenactment

"Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up. 2 He said: "In a certain town there was a judge who neither feared God nor cared what people thought. 3 And there was a widow in that town who kept coming to him with the plea, 'Grant me justice against my adversary.'

4 "For some time he refused. But finally he said to himself, 'Even though I don't fear God or care what people think, 5 yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will see that she gets justice, so that she won't eventually come and attack me!'"

6 And the Lord said, "Listen to what the unjust judge says. 7 And will not God bring about justice for his chosen ones, who cry out to him day and night? Will he keep putting them off? 8 I tell you, he will see that they get justice, and quickly. However, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on the earth?"

Day 1 - Read, then imagine and have kids act it out.

Day 2 - How does this parable connect to the OT or whole biblical narrative? What does it teach us? What other Bible stories do you know that teach us about being persistent? When we pray, we must be persistent and not give up.

Day 3 - Talk about a piece of art associated with the passage (<u>The Persistent Widow</u>, <u>Persistence</u> is the Key, <u>Suprised by Persistence</u>).

Profession of Faith

(Nicene Creed, Apostles' Creed, Heidelberg Confession Q&A #1)

*One line is added to the creed/confession each week; each text is memorized over the course of many weeks.

Q. What is your only comfort in life and in death?

A. That I am not my own, but belong—body and soul, in life and in death—to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ. Week One

He has fully paid for all my sins with his precious blood, and has set me free from the tyranny of the devil. He also watches over me in such a way that not a hair can fall from my head without the will of my Father in heaven; in fact, all things must work together for my salvation. Week Two

Because I belong to him, Christ, by his Holy Spirit, assures me of eternal life and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for him. Week Three

<u>Prayer</u>

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Let us pray:

Day 1 - Adult offers a short prayer of dedication.

Day 2 - Adult provides prompts (ie. Pray for family, friends, city, those who are sad), kids can offer a word or sentence of prayer after each prompt. ie. Let us pray for: family, friends, people in trouble, other countries...

Day 3 - A child or children pray.

The Lord's Prayer

*Holding hands in a circle or individual hands open and outstretched in the sign of the orans

Let us bless the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

Optional --- Doxology, Hymn, or Weekly Psalm Refrain

ie. God is So Good, Doxology (Old 100th), Jesus, the Light of the World
