Notes from quant researcher:

- Should expect biases in the respondents. Will want to pay careful attention to the responses to “what are your current roles” to understand that bias. People will self-select to those who care the most.
- Unless we get good numbers, we may not be able to do much in comparisons between groups. A couple dozen is too small of sample size. But we may be able to say “this group in general was more likely to be able to do...”
- A self-select survey is going to capture the groups that are most motivated to give feedback. In a perfect scenario, we would know the relative distribution of the roles out in the world of who is using these, and then want to make sure

that we are getting respondents (thought a survey recruitment) to make sure that we achieve parity in respondents with the actual usage)
