Course Description:

Sixth grade Social Studies is a year long course focusing on the state of Minnesota. Students will use the tools of geography, history, economics and government to engage in historical inquiry and study events, issues, and individuals significant to Minnesota history, beginning with the early indigenous people of the Mississippi River region to the present day. Students will learn about the unique role Minnesota played, and continues to play, in the regional, national, and global setting.

We will be using a textbook from the Minnesota Historical Society, *Northern Lights* as well as the online version of the textbook. An updated list of the websites used in class can be found on my website listed above.

Class Expectations:

- Prepared Respectful Involved Determined Everyday
- Be on time! You should be in your desk working on the warm-up when the bell rings.
- Students need to stay in their seats until dismissal.
- Bring all materials and assignments to class daily.
- Tend to your folder and notebooks like a garden stay organized!
- If you are absent, it is your responsibility to find out what you missed. Additional copies of missing assignments are available online or in the classroom.

- All assignments and due dates will be displayed on the whiteboard and on the calendar embedded in the teacher website.

- Students with missing or incomplete work will be asked to stay after school with Ms. Penner. Points will not be deducted for late work until the deadline. Missing and late work will be documented in Parentvue to track patterns.
- All missing assignments will be available online and in the classroom.
- There is no extra credit given in this course.
- Assignments and assessments will be graded and returned in a timely manner.

2019-2020 Edgewood Reassessment Practice:

Students will have two weeks from the due date to turn in missing work for credit. After those two weeks, no missing assignments will be given credit. Students should still complete and submit missing assignments to get feedback and be prepared for the assessments. Missing work will be documented in StudentVUE.

All reassessments will need to be completed TWO WEEKS after the student receives feedback and their score from the initial assessment. There are several actions that are required before a student may reassess. These actions include that all missing work from the unit must be complete, students must complete a reflection to the initial assessment, and attend at least one relearning session. Please refer to the Edgewood Middle School Reassessment Practice for additional information.

Students with missing or incomplete work, or who need to attend a relearning session will be asked to stay after school.
