### **Industry Updates**

- Builders First Source & Riddlebrothers: Struggle to compete against Amazon. Not getting resumes for skilled employees. Not as many skilled employees applying.
- Riddlebrothers is going to start advertising on Youtube and FB. Using AI to write service reports to look professional written etc.
- Needing to rethink how to recruit. I.e RTO, (reasonable time off) pet insurance, gyms, child care

### **School Updates**

- VCTC: Steady increase of enrollment (approx. 600 application for 450 spots) Adding aviation, continue to work with industrial maintenance - next big things is spacing
- Staunton City: Focus on branding/marketing CTE for next year. Looking to fill an FCS position. Using social media to promote internships and CTE courses. SCS has filled an IT and custodian position internally with student internships. February CTE was successful for creating awareness.

### **Employment Updates**

- Dynamic Aviation: Has a new contract but need 300 new employees
- CAVA - opening in the spring in Verona - Hiring 52 people for the next three years.
- Additional buildings are being built in GreenHill but the company has not been announced.
- Reminder to know that hirings are phased over 3-5 years.
- Augusta - Manufacturing (food and Bev.) Value added Agriculture, Life Science (Holister)
- Staunton - Not looking for distribution, similar to Augusta, technology data center.

### **Discussion**

- Can VCTC get into an HR retiring package for recruiting? To have a structured approach. Idea to partner with SHERM(?) VCTC can not get an account with Indeed due to financial policies. (BRCC is going to see how they are able to post on indeed.)
- AI - BRCC is dealing with it and have adopted plagiarism policies. They use software called turn it in but it's not being recommended we use it. Trying to promote my PBA

learning. BRCC created a task force to look at using it more efficiently and how to police it etc. Narratives are coming in for VCTC etc using AI.

- Peter Denbigh has started a group and have start workshops to start the discussion. Hannah Cooper is on the committee and would be a person to reach out too. A Waynesboro innovation hub is opening.
- BRCC - Oct. 30 - at Expo - Staunton, Augusta, Waynesboro, Rockingham, and Harrisonburg

    - Needs are greater and it's becoming more technical

### **Industry & Workforce Updates - What are needs?**

- SIH - 140 companies represented
- McKee
  - Been struggling in skills positions and looking for a pipeline
  - Started a grow your own -line mechanics and electronic technicians - hire maintenance utilities (\$22 starting pay) after taking a mechanical test and train

for 6 mo before becoming a mechanic, students need to be 18, mechanics starts at \$30

- willing to speak to students in the industrial maintenance students at VCTC
- WBL - possible for students who are 18 and have time in schedule
- best benefits package in the county
- New businesses asking to come to the area?
  - Staunton Innovation Hub - tech industry, software development, thrive pediatrics
  - Valley - food and beverage manufacturing, more and more about agriculture businesses
  - Using VCTC and HS for business tours about tailoring to businesses
- First Builders Source
  - CDL Driver laws have changed and people now have to take a course to get a certification; BRCC is full for CDL - income and pay levels high
- Augusta Health
  - National nursing shortage and looking to reduce travel contracted work; PCT, CNA, LPNS are needed; Interested in the PCT program.
- Riddleberger
  - Struggle finding experienced workers for HVAC; interviewing a lot of younger kids...biggest struggle is that younger students do not know how to communicate and showcase themselves.
  - Can not stress soft skills - looking people in the eye, shaking hands, etc.
  - Love field trips elaborate prefab and duct work

## Education Updates

### BRCC

- Spoke of mechatronic program and Hershey's and could Mckee also partner and possible DE work
- Agriculture enrollment up
- Starting a med tech program
- 100% pass rate for all vet tech boards
- career pathways offering workshop with alternative schools and doing a soft skills workshop

### VCTC

- 20% increase of student enrollment (added industrial maintenance, PCT, etc.) Not quite at capacity but close.
- October 23rd business appreciation luncheon (51 students completed 1600 hours)
- Job Fair with MTC - tentatively April 11th
- Industrial maintenance, added clinical medical
- Put in for GoVA grant for Region 8 - unofficially getting grant and it passed the state board review committee - \$820,000 Go to work in manufacturing and transportation - funds will support addition of aviation technology - currently have a pilot program in gov. school
- New staff in HVAC, criminal justice and precision machine
- Low enrollment in precision but not a concern at this point

- Awarded CTE Innovation Grant (\$37,000) for 2 Robo Dog
- New CTE staff at high school
