 - b. Chamber ensemble Strings, clarinet, piano (6 musicians): Ensemble Musique Oblique, France
 - c. Score by Camille Saint-Saens (1835-1921) French Romantic composer
 - d. For a French silent film from 1908- 3rd earliest original film score. (Others were composed only 4 months earlier).
 - e. Original due to having score by celebrated composer.
 - f. Film scores began as a way to drown out the sound of the projector!
- 3. Listen again and draw.

- 4. Play 2nd song. Have children draw, but don't introduce song.
- 5. Share info
 - a. Main Title/ Rebel Blockade Runner from Star Wars
 - b. Orchestra
 - c. John Williams (b. 1932)- contemporary classical composer
 - d. 1977
 - e. 2005- American Film Institute chose this score as greatest film score of all time.
 - f. Star Wars score uses leitmotif- melodies that follow a particular character.
- 6. Listen again and draw.
