

Cleaning Your School Device

For the Chromebook keyboard and non-screen areas, a small amount of isopropyl alcohol on a microfiber cloth can be used. For the screen, use a screen cleaner solution made for electronics. You can also make your own:

- Get 100% pure white vinegar.
- Get distilled water.
- Mix the vinegar and distilled water in a 75:25 ratio. That means for every 3 parts distilled water, and 1 part white vinegar.
- Dump the solution into a spray bottle.
- Shake vigorously.

Always dampen the cloth instead of spraying any liquid directly onto your display. The key word here is "dampen." Don't oversaturate the cloth.

You can use anti-bacterial wipes for the outside case and outside cover of the device.

How to properly clean electronic devices

Do's

Follow the manufacture's recommendations if possible.

Be gentle- screens and smartphone screens can break if too much pressure is applied.

Use a microfiber cloth (a clean soft cotton tee-shirt will also work).

Use Cotton balls or cotton swabs (Q-Tips).

Clean them often, especially if shared.

Clean before transferring device back to work or school for service.

Don'ts

Don't use paper towel or other paper products, it can cause scratching.

Don't use bleach wipes.

Don't use abrasive cleaning pads.

Don't use caustic or abrasive cleaning products.
