Renovation Set to Begin for Ludlow Early Learning

The construction fence is up at Ludlow! Renovations will begin shortly as we prepare for the opening of the Ludlow Early Learning Center in Fall 2025. Ludlow will accommodate an expanded pre-Kindergarten program, so all Shaker students have a strong foundation for lifelong learning.

This space is designed with early learning in mind, featuring spaces to accommodate occupational and physical therapy, preschool-aged playground equipment and outdoor learning spaces, flexible furniture designed for our youngest learners, smart storage and more! The Ludlow school building will have 11 classrooms, a physical therapy room, a gymnasium, a multipurpose room and a secure vestibule entrance. Read more about the Ludlow Early Learning Center here.

To Ludlow We Go, 2025!

Scheduled to open in August 2025, the building will welcome over 200 Preschool children and 40 staff members to create a center of excellence in early learning. A Message from the School Nurse

HOW DO I KNOW WHEN I SHOULDN'T SEND MY CHILD TO SCHOOL?

Here are some helpful tips to decide if you should send your child to school:

SCHOOL Nurse

Ask yourself: "Is my child well enough to learn in school today?"

Contagious illness: Please do not send your child to school if you suspect or know that your child has any contagious illness. Some of the most common contagious diseases include: Covid-19, strep throat, influenza, head lice, ringworm, and pink eye (conjunctivitis).

Children should be kept home if they have an emerging illness or a fever of 100 degrees fahrenheit or higher. **DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD WITH A FEVER TO SCHOOL ON FEVER-REDUCING MEDICATION** (like Tylenol or Motrin/Advil). These medications do not prevent the spread of any illness.

In addition to the illnesses listed above, please keep your child home from school if he/she has any of the following symptoms:

- 1. Fever of 100.4 F or higher (child should be fever-free for 24 hours without medication before returning to school)
- 2. Vomiting and/or diarrhea (should not return to school until 24 hours after symptoms stop)
- 3. Frequent, severe cough
- 4. Fresh cold with a constantly runny nose
- 5. Rash that has not been diagnosed and/or treated
- 6. Difficult or rapid breathing
- 7. Yellowish skin or eyes
- 8. Unusually dark urine and/or gray or white stool
- 9. Suspected strep throat; Keep child home until after throat culture results are known and 24 hours after medication is started to treat the infection
- 10. Itchy red eye or eye with sticky drainage
- 11. Other symptoms that suggest the child is ill and/or should not be at school

Peanut Free Zone!

We can never take food allergens lightly! Please be mindful of the fact that we are a peanut free school. It is important that there is strict avoidance to this food in order to prevent a life-threatening allergic reaction. To reduce the chance of this occurring, we are asking that you do not send any peanut or nut containing products with your child that will be eaten in the school.

If your child has eaten peanuts/nuts before coming to school, please be sure your child's hands and face have been thoroughly washed before entering the school. We thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

Dressing for the Weather

This is just a friendly reminder that students need to come to school properly dressed for the weather. As the weather gets colder and wet, students need to have the following items: winter hat, mittens/gloves, scarf/neck warmer, winter boots, snow pants and a proper winter jacket.

Please continue practicing zipping up jackets at home. Despite the cold weather, we will be going outside, unless there has been a weather advisory stating that we cannot go outside or if it's raining.

Please make sure to adjust your child's extra change of clothing that is kept at school, or in their bookbag, to match the season.



- For employees with child care expenses, the Child Care Voucher Program provides cash grants once a year for work-related child care expenses.

The amount you receive depends on:

- Your family adjusted gross income.
- Your hours and pay periods worked.
- Your number of dependents.
