المسافرون - Hollow Verbs

Hollow verbs are verbs that have a vowel in the middle as a part of their root, like استطاع and زار

In the present tense, the middle vowel stays put:

In the past tense, their middle vowel disappears for first and second person

There is a method to the madness!!

In Arabic, two sukkuns (the circle * that indicates no vowel sound/syllable) can't be next to each other!

Note: Do NOT confuse hollow verbs with measure III verbs!! Such as شاهد - see measures for more details about measure patterns.
