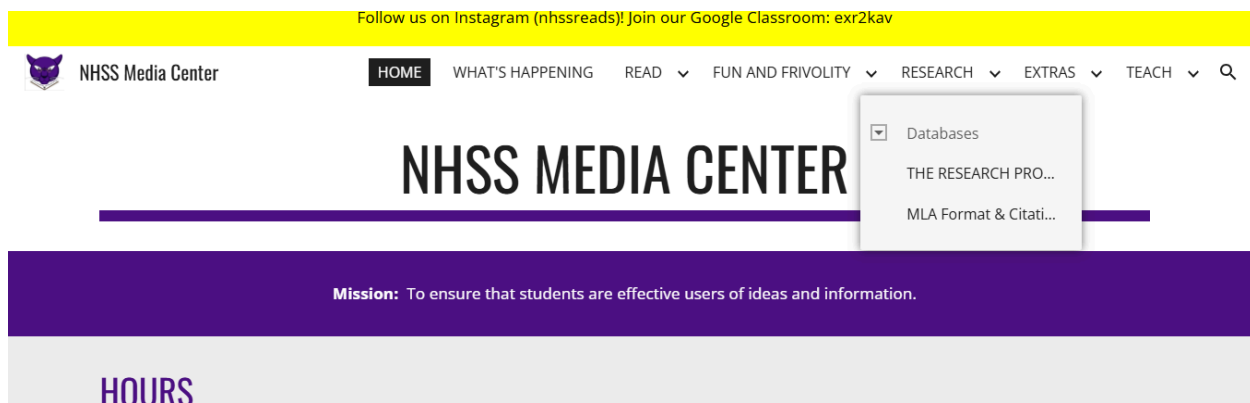

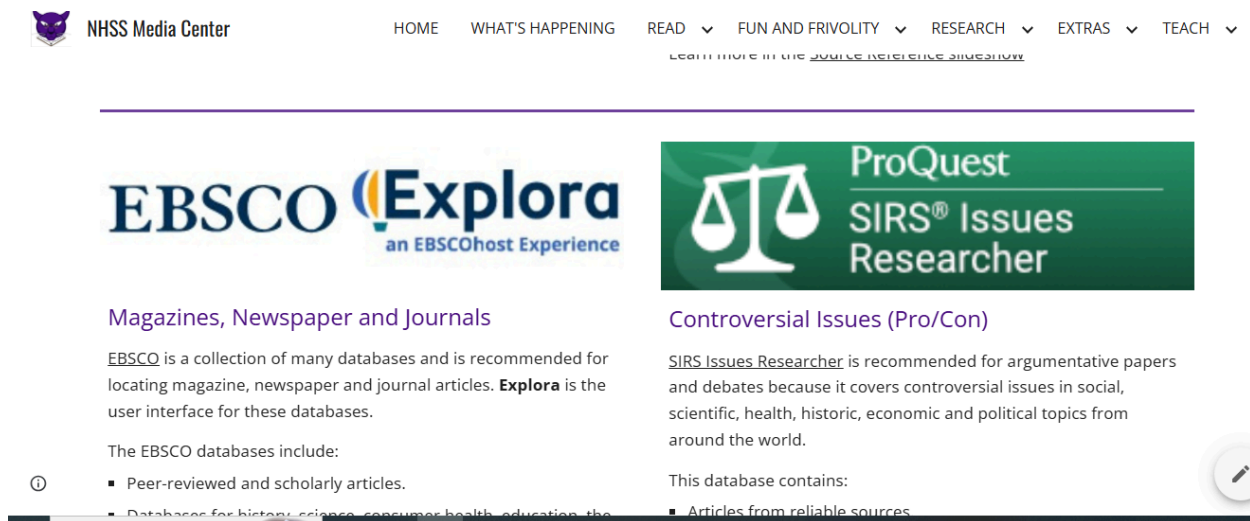

STEP 1:

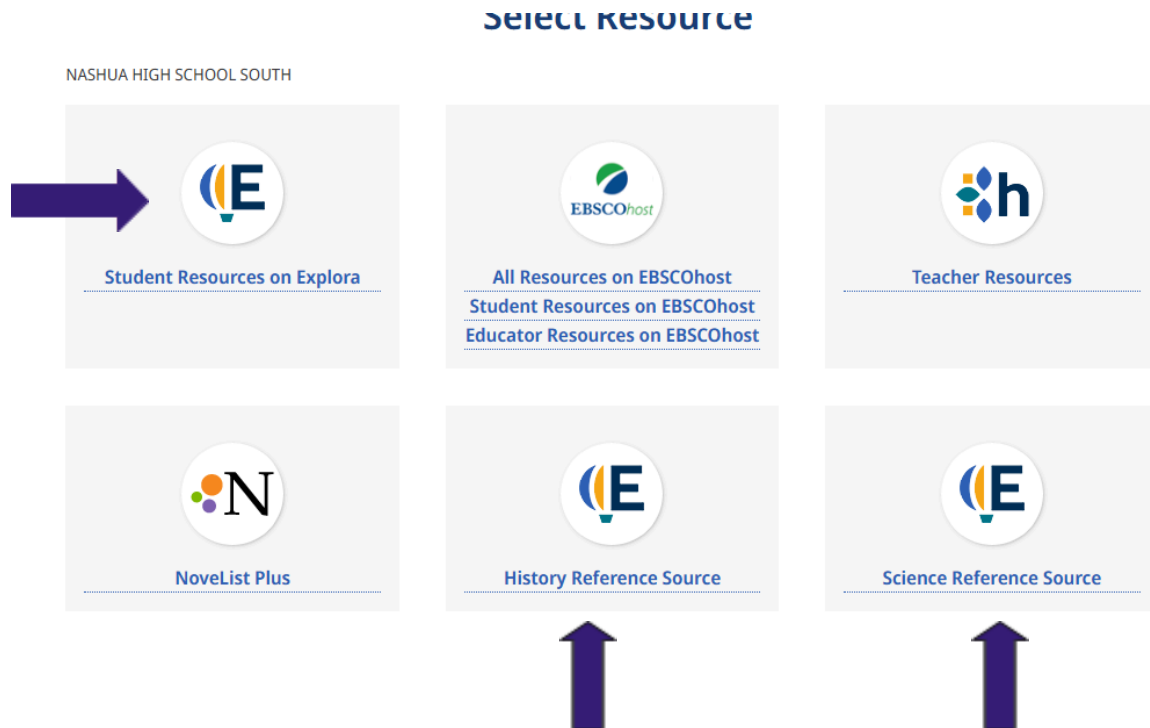

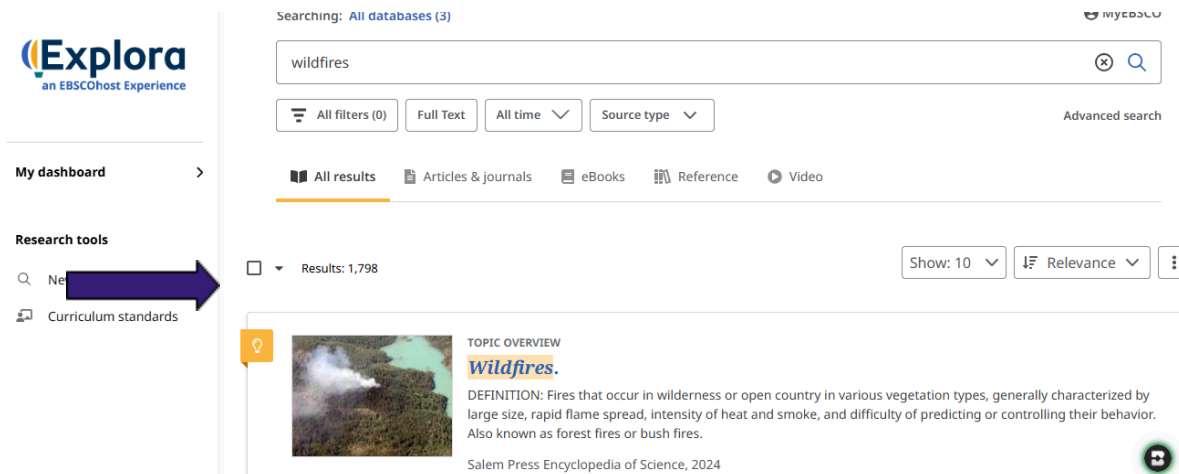
STEP 3:

Explora, History Reference, and Science Reference will be the most helpful.



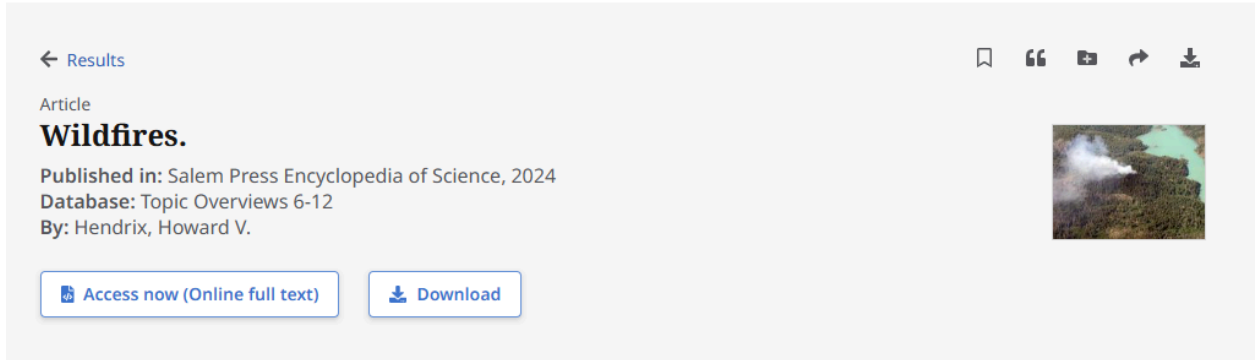
STEP 4:

When you start searching, you will be given a number of results including articles, ebooks, and even videos.

When you open an article, you have the option to download it or read the full text online.

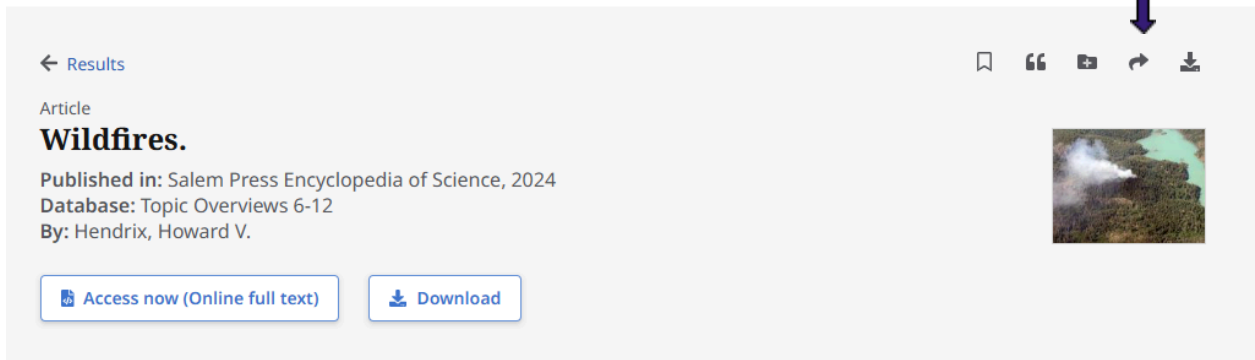

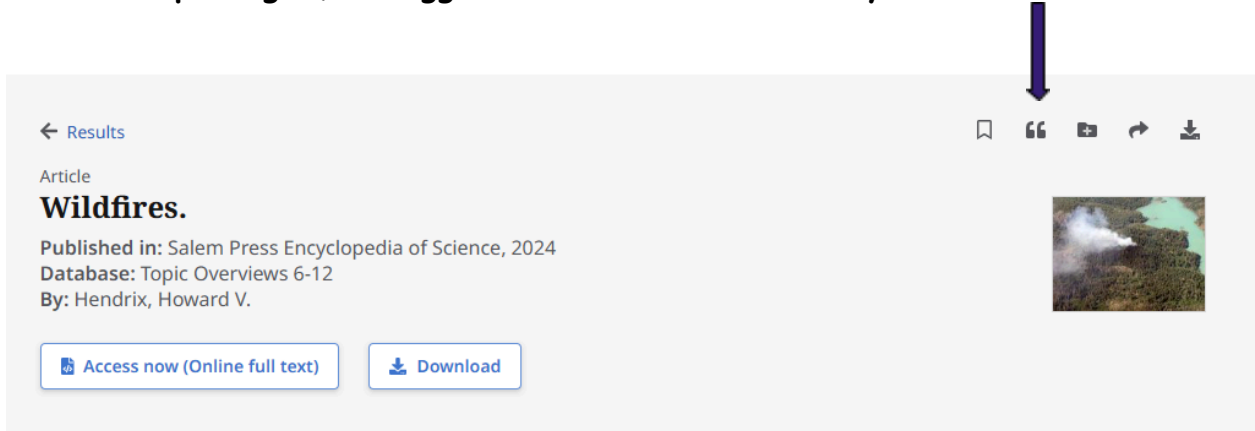

You should always immediately save the MLA citation for the resource. If you don't end up using it, no biggie. Better safe than sorry.

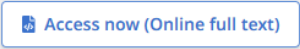
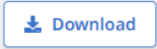
