Elm Street Elementary School, students participating in the Title I Part A program, and their families, agree that this compact outlines how the parents, the entire school staff, and the students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement as well as describes how the school and parents will build and develop a partnership that will help children achieve the State's high standards.

JOINTLY DEVELOPED

The parents, students, and staff of Elm Street jointly developed this school-parent compact for achievement. Teachers suggested home learning strategies, parents added input about the types of support they need, and students shared what would help them learn. Parents are invited to attend annual revision meetings (April/May each year) to review the compact and make suggestions based on student needs and improvement goals. Parents are encouraged to participate in our annual Title I parent survey (spring) that is also used as a tool to collect parent feedback regarding the current Title I programs and policies. Parents may give input year-round through our website as well.

To understand how working together can benefit your child, it is first important to understand the district's and school's goals for student academic achievement.

COWETA COUNTY SCHOOL SYSTEM GOALS:

During the 2025-26 school year, the percentage of students scoring Proficient or Distinguished on the **English Language Arts** Milestones Assessment will increase 8% (67% to 75%).

During the 2025-26 school year, the percentage of students scoring Proficient or Distinguished on the *Mathematics* Milestones Assessment will increase by 3% (74% to 77%).

ELM STREET ELEMENTARY GOALS:

During the 2025-26 school year, Elm Street will increase the percentage of all students' scores on the ELA Milestones Assessment by 7% (75% to 82%).

During the 2025-26 school year, Elm Street will increase the percentage of all students' scores on the *Mathematics* Milestones Assessment by 4% (89.6% to 94%).

Grade levels will have specific focus areas relevant to the school goals:

K-2 phonemic awareness, phonics, metacognition, vocabulary, number sense

3-5 reciprocal teaching, academic student discussion, metacognition, math mindset, number sense

- ★ Schedule skills block to maximize differentiated instructional time and resources.
- ★ Share a weekly academic overview in the form of a digital or paper newsletter.
- ★ Provide a quarterly newsletter which includes a focus on academic growth and/or strategies to support learning at home.

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

We, as parents, will:

- ★ Review weekly Eagle folders with graded assignments to share academic progress and/or regularly check Infinite Campus for updated grades and discuss with children.
- ★ Review regular assessment data and will attend annual group and/or individual conferences.
- ★ Attend special events such as Mardi Gras Math Night to learn/experience strategies to support student learning at home.
- * Read the weekly academic overview in the form of a digital or paper newsletter.
- ★ View the quarterly school newsletter to support learning at home.
- \star Practice strategies learned through events, newsletters, etc at home to support learning.
