




## Week 6 Theme: Making Books

This week's challenge is to create a **non-fiction book** for children. The book should share information about your community. You will create a book through Bookcreator.com by joining class code 6RKHHLS to capture information about your street, neighborhood, city, or the state of Colorado.

You will have the option of completing your book about a STEM or Arts topic. STEM books should be based on a topic in science, technology, engineering, or math from your community. These topics could include your local ecosystem, environmental issues in your community, use of natural resources to build your community, how technology is seen in your community, and more. Arts books should be based on a topic that highlights connection, humanity, social challenges, or families in your community.



Non-fiction is literature that uses real information, or facts. Nonfiction can include many categories, such as biography, cooking, psychology, and more. Examples of non-fiction books include The Immortal Life of Henrietta Lacks, Silent Spring, and Unbroken. Children's books are stories made specifically for children, with often simpler language, pictures, and clear ideas. Examples of non-fiction children's books include Martin's Big Words or I Am Jane Goodall: Ordinary People Change the World.
