State Summative Assessments Purpose and Use:

State summative assessments are designed to be point-in-time snapshots of what students know and can do in core content areas near the end of the year. They help students and their families know how they are performing compared to standards and compared to their peers and how they've grown over time. They enable teachers to see how their students are performing against the standard and identify areas they may need to adjust in their practice in the future. And, they provide school/district leaders, the state, policymakers, and the public with information on how well the system is meeting the goal of helping every child attain academic proficiency. The data are used to inform continuous improvement of the system at all levels.
