- Survey tool with multiple classroom uses
 - exit tickets
 - quizzes
 - answer sheets
 - Classroom information (parents/students/colleagues)
 - mimic other test formats
 - PARCC

 - conditional formatting
- Multiple question-types
 - text
 - paragraph text
 - multiple choice
 - short answer
 - list
 - checkboxes
 - paragraph
 - scale
 - time
 - date

- Show progress bar at the bottom of form pages
