17:15 – 17:45	<p><b>Business Action to Prevent and Address Child Labour</b></p> <p><b>Panel Description:</b></p> <p>Child labour has no place in our society. Yet, 160 million children today are still subject to child labour according to the latest ILO and UNICEF estimates. Companies have a duty to address their adverse human rights impacts in their operations and supply chains, which will help tackle child labour. But making a real impact requires understanding the root causes of child labour, including decent work deficits such as poverty wages. Adopting sustainable practices which will prevent the occurrence of child labour is the best way to ensure children are not deprived of the childhood, safety, health and education they deserve.</p> <p>In 2021, the international community, including the private sector, has accelerated efforts to tackle child labour as part the <b>International Year for the Elimination of Child Labour</b>.
