Resumo (first abstract in Portuguese; bold, centered, size 11)

O resumo deverá ter de 80 a 100 palavras, fonte Times New Roman, tamanho 11, espaçamento simples, justificado, sem recuo de parágrafo e composto de um único parágrafo, não havendo citações. Explícite o objeto do estudo, contexto, objetivo, fundamentação, metodologia e resultados, se pertinentes. As palavras-chave devem aparecer logo abaixo do resumo, são 5 (cinco) palavras-chave separadas por ponto (.).

Abstract (second abstract in English; bold, centered and size 11)

The abstract must contain between 80 and 100 words, in Times New Roman font, size 11, single spacing, justified alignment, without paragraph indentation, and written as a single paragraph, with no citations. It should explicitly present the object of the study, context, objective, theoretical foundation, methodology, and results, when pertinent. Keywords must appear immediately below the abstract. Five (5) keywords should be provided, separated by periods (.).

Resumen (tercer resumen en español; negrita, centrada y tamaño 11)

El resumen deberá contener entre 80 y 100 palabras, en fuente Times New Roman, tamaño 11, interlineado sencillo, alineación justificada, sin sangría y redactado en un único párrafo, sin citas. Deberá explicitar el objeto del estudio, contexto, objetivo, fundamentación teórica, metodología y resultados, cuando sean pertinentes. Las palabras clave deberán aparecer inmediatamente debajo del resumen. Se deberán incluir 5 (cinco) palabras clave separadas por punto (.).

Introduction (Bold, with only the first letter capitalized)

The Mini-Article must be original and consistent with the theme of the issue. It may be produced individually or in co-authorship (one author and a maximum of four co-authors). A proponent may serve as first author on no more than two works. The **Mini-Article Template** must be submitted in two versions: an identified version, in which the authors' names appear in the

document, and a non-identified version. Both versions—identified and non-identified—must be submitted through the form: <https://forms.gle/ZkiKytHLpeePviMb7>.

The body of the article must contain four to five pages, from the Introduction to the References. The text must be in Times New Roman, size 12, with 1.5 line spacing, a first-line paragraph indent of 1.25 cm, and no extra spacing between paragraphs. The work must be prepared on A4-sized pages, with all margins set to 2.0 cm, and submitted in .docx format.

Long direct quotations (more than three lines) must be indented 4 cm from the left margin, single-spaced, in Times New Roman, size 11, and followed by the author's surname, with only the initial letter capitalized, the year of the cited work, and the page number. (Author, year, p. ??-??)

“Short direct quotations (up to three lines) must appear within the text enclosed in quotation marks, using the same formatting as the main text and including authorship information, as in this example” (Author, year, p. ??).

Subsection Headings

Subsection headings must be in lowercase, bold, justified, in Times New Roman, size 12, with no special indentation.

Footnotes must be concise, objective, and clear; in Times New Roman, size 10; numbered; single-spaced; and justified. When necessary to complement or clarify the text, figures, tables, and graphs may be included. These must be accompanied by a Title (Times New Roman, size 12, centered) and a Source (Times New Roman, size 11, centered), and must be numbered sequentially according to their type (see Table 1). They should be cited in the text as close as possible to their placement. Insert one blank line before and one blank line after each Figure, Table, or Graph, as illustrated in **Table 1** on the submission modalities.

Source: Indicate the source of the figure, table, or graph. If it is the author's own work, use the word “Author,” followed by the year in parentheses. If it is taken from another work, use the author's name followed by the year of publication and the page number (Author, year, p. ?).

The reference list must follow ABNT standards (left-aligned, single-spaced, with one blank line between entries) and must include only the references that are effectively cited in the body of the text.

References

For all references, Times New Roman, size 12, must be used. Authors' surnames should appear in capital letters, and only the initial letters of given names should be used. When there is more than one author, the names must be separated by semicolons. The following guidelines and examples are provided.

(For a Book)

SURNAME, Abbreviated Name. **Title of the Book** (in bold): subtitle (if any). Edition. Place of publication: Publisher (without the word “Publisher”), year.

Example:

D’AMBROSIO, U. **Educação Matemática**: da teoria à prática. Campinas: Papirus, 2007.

(For a Book Chapter)

SURNAME, Abbreviated Name. Title of the Chapter. In: SURNAME, Abbreviated Name. **Title of the Book** (in bold). Place of publication: Publisher, year. v. followed by the volume number (if applicable), page numbers (first and last pages of the chapter) separated by a hyphen.

Example:

SOUSA, O. S. “Ethnomathematics has worked, and VEm Brasil is proof of that”. In: BORBA, M. C.; OREY, D. C. (org.). **Ubiratan D’Ambrosio and Mathematics Education**. Cham, Suíça: Springer, 2023. p. 121-144.

(For a Journal and/or Periodical Article)

SURNAME, Abbreviated Name. Title of the Article. Title of the Journal/Periodical (in bold), City of publication, v. followed by the volume number, n. followed by the issue number, p. followed by the first and last page numbers of the article, separated by a hyphen, abbreviated month, year. Available at: link. Accessed on: day abbreviated month. year. (when available on the Internet).

In: NAME OF THE EVENT (capital letters), edition number of the event in Arabic numerals, year, City where the event was held. **Title of the Event Publication...** City of publication: Publisher, year of publication. p. followed by the page numbers (first and last pages of the work), separated by a hyphen. Physical description (CD-ROM, printed version, etc.). Notes.

(For Dissertations and Theses)

SURNAME, Abbreviated Name. **Title of the Work:** subtitle. Year of submission. Number of volumes followed by v., or number of pages/leaves followed by f. (if a single volume). Dissertation (Master's Degree in ...) or Thesis (Doctorate in ...) – Faculty of ... or Institute of ..., Name of the Institution, City of defense, year of defense.
