K. Summary of My Activities and Future Plans

Throughout my academic career, my main interest and focus has been on transferring the latest methodologies, models and ways of thinking in the field of child development from academia to the field. I strive to make state of the art knowledge accessible to professionals and expose them to the latest state of the art knowledge available, relevant researches, evidence base intervention programs etc.

Current involvement within the Department of Psychology and Future Plans

Activities within the M.A. Program in Developmental Psychology

Designing an applied program

I designed and developed the field work (practicum) program for first- and second-year students. Until my association with the program, students were not involved and organized in a structured practicum

Development projects

In this context, I am involved in several projects:

Empowering women in the Bedouin sector in the Misgav Regional Council

The Misgav Regional Council contains six Bedouin communities in which approximately a third of the population of Misgav resides. Most women in these communities do not work outside the home and focus on raising their children. In recent years, family day care centers have been established to enable women who are

interested in joining the labor force to do so, and to ease the burden of women caring for many children. The family day care centers are managed by Bedouin women from the communities and are under the supervision of the Council's Department of Education and Welfare.

The target populations of this project, which I designed and managed, were 26 women managers of 26-day care centers in four Bedouin communities. I created a three-phase training project and implemented it over a period of three years. The ultimate objective of the program was to train the women as parental instructors in the communities. At present, one year after the end of the project, reports from the field indicate the beginnings of change in the status of these women in the communities. Four of the women enrolled in the early childhood program at Oranim.

Improving the quality of care in day care centers

It is no secret that the quality of care in Israeli day care centers is very poor. At greatest risk are children from birth to age three, who spend extended periods of time in daycare centers that lack supervision and operate in hazardous conditions.

I was asked to be a part of the steering committee headed by Tamar Almog, head of Day Care Department at the Ministry of Industry, Trade and Labor. Together with Prof. Avi Sagi-Schwartz I developed intervention programs for the improvement of the quality of care at day care centers.

In addition, I have been leading the program for the improvement of day care centers in the Misgav Regional Municipality. The program covered most Misgav day care centers. At the most basic level, all day care center managers learn about current knowledge regarding children's emotional development and about the standards necessary for quality group care. In practice, eight-day care centers were upgraded. As a result, in some of the day care centers the level of care is very high. Specifically, the day care center in Yuvalim has become a learning center, where visitors in the field of early childhood education arrive from all over the country.

In light of the success of the program, we receive many requests from other locations to implement it. For example, I am currently leading an intervention program in daycare centers in the city Maalot-Tarshicha. Due its innovative treatment model, the program received \$500000 in philanthropic funding for a period of 5 years – an unprecedented achievement in daycare intervention programs.

Child custody issues and children in the legal system

My training both as a social worker and as a developmental psychologist has led me to the field of children at risk in general and to custody issues in particular. I deal with issues of adoption, foster care, and divorce. Over the years, I have been asked to serve on various committees addressing these subjects, including two national committees: The Gross Committee for Foster Care and Adoption and the Shnit Committee on parental responsibility in the course of divorce. I was appointed to the Shnit Committee as an expert by the Minister Tzipi Livni (then Minister of Justice) and I served on it for five years. The final report of the Committee incorporates a section written by myself and Prof. Avi Sagi-Schwartz.

In addition, I developed and managed the following programs:

Child Welfare Service

I developed and conducted seminars for the Adoption Service. The seminars expanded the participants' knowledge about the social and emotional development of children and provide exposure to new areas of research and programs in the field of adoption. Currently, the Service was involved in a VIPP workshop, a video-based intervention program designed to improve the relationships between mothers and children. The program was developed in Holland and is implemented as a post-adoption program for families. Because of the lack of post-adoption programs in Israel, I am currently involved in training and teaching associated with the Dutch program, with the intention to implement it in Israel.

Family Judges

I initiated a learning group in child development for judges and experts in order to discuss complex legal issues related to adoption, removal of children from the home, immigration, and more. This group just started in Tel Aviv and had two meetings.

Welfare Officers Specializing in Legal and Guardianship Procedures

In recent years I developed several training programs for welfare officials specializing in personal and guardianship matters. The programs included seminars, discussion groups, workshops, and support of the welfare units in the northern region. My unique contribution is in changing the attitudes of welfare officials about the father's role in the life of a child after divorce. As a result, there is thorough understanding of the importance of the father's involvement in the child's emotional development. This

understanding is reflected in recommendations of the welfare administration for more hours to be spent by children with their fathers, including the need for children to sleep over with their fathers already in the early years.

Last year I established the "Update line," a service by which I transfer recent research materials to the regional welfare administrations.

Current involvement within the Interdisciplinary M.A. Program in Child Development

My experience with professionals who work with children raised the need to disseminate advanced knowledge in child development. In response to this need, we launched the Interdisciplinary M.A. Program for Child Development designed for a range of professionals that provide services for young children (e.g. Occupational Therapy, Speech and Language Pathology, Physical Therapy, Nursing, Early Childhood Education, Social Work, and others).

Our program is the first of its kind in Israel and one of the few in the world that has been designed with a focus on training professionals from these disciplines. A particular focus of the program is in training experienced professionals who are or will soon be in leadership roles in order to promote the well-being of young children with special needs.

M.A program in Child Development for Family and Youth Judges

Serving as Amicus Coria and expert in court, I understood the need to provide advance knowledge to judges in the Family and Youth court. With Prof. Avi Sagi-Schwartz I developed and opened a program for Family and Youth Judges. The program was designed to significantly upgrade the quality of the judges work in court. Its aim was to expand and deepen the knowledge in child development, as well as provide tools for critical decisions concerning families and children attending court.

M.A program in Child Development for Interdisciplinary International Student

This Year I opened the first interdisciplinary international program in child development. The program is designed to train international experts who will focus on pressing questions regarding the nature of child development and how it applies to the lives of children and their families.

This unique interdisciplinary program aims to provide professionals with a comprehensive theoretical basis and an applied skillset that will be effective in influencing the well-being of children in a positive manner. The program is designed for professionals with experience working with children: social workers, occupational therapists, communication clinicians, physical therapists, public health nurses and nurses in pediatric departments, family and youth judges and family lawyers, special educators, public policy makers and others.

Professional activity outside the university

Tamuz Institute

In 1994 I established the Tamuz Institute in Haifa, and in 2000 another branch was opened in Tel Aviv. The institute employs a multidisciplinary team of clinical and educational psychologists, social workers, child therapists, family therapists, and psychiatrists. Since the year 2000, owing to the high level of instruction provided at the Institute, it has been recognized by the Ministry of Health as a specialization site for clinical psychologists. The reach of the Institute extends beyond traditional therapy and is also preventive. In this capacity, the Institute maintains significant ties with the community, for example, by providing training to Eran volunteers, providing counseling and guidance to the Rape Victims Assistance Center, helping establish parent groups in the gay and lesbian community in Tel Aviv, and more.
