

Policy 16: UNIFORM POLICY

Updated and approved by Board of Directors: January 2025

PURPOSE

This policy defines the uniform(s) that must be worn by coaches and players of Kitchener Minor Baseball Association (KMBA) teams at all games.

REQUIREMENTS

A KMBA uniform consists of the following:

- A jersey approved by KMBA and provided by the official KMBA uniform supplier
- A cap approved by KMBA and provided by the official KMBA uniform supplier
- White baseball pants
- Black socks or blue socks matching the KMBA blue colour. All team members choosing to expose more than 1 inch of their socks must wear the same colour socks.
- Black belt
- Black undershirt or blue undershirt matching KMBA blue colour.

An approved uniform must be worn for all games with the following exceptions:

- Modifications in alignment with an event theme (ie. pink caps for cancer awareness, specially issued uniform pieces approved by KMBA).
- Anything for which a special exception has been granted by KMBA

PENALTY

Players may be removed from games for illegal use of equipment if not worn as intended.

If any team wears any uniform that has not been approved by KMBA they will be subject to a fine of \$500 and coaches will be subject to a 2 game suspension. Upon notification to the head coach, the team will be given 72 hours to pay the fine. If not paid within 72 hours, the team will be suspended until fine is paid.

REVIEW AND UPDATES

This policy will be reviewed periodically to ensure its effectiveness and compliance with relevant laws, regulations, and best practices. Updates or revisions to the policy will be incorporated into KMBA's governance practices as necessary.

By adhering to this policy, we uphold the values of integrity, accountability, and transparency within KMBA and demonstrate our commitment to serving the best interests of the organization and its members.
