Queering Fire and Ash Workshop by Ko Rupert (Komencanto Eterna)

Description:

This workshop will provide a path to queering (disrupting normative understandings of) fire, ash, and other materials through a guided presentation of works by a diverse group of scholars, artists, and activists followed by a group conversation on queering materials. Emphasis throughout the workshop will be placed on queering as action, Indigenous and Asian/American anticolonial lenses, and on the unprecedented ongoing wildfires in so-called Canada that have covered much of the so-called eastern United States in smoke and ash.
