Learning Session 1 <i>"See the Story, Change the Story: Using Data to Champion for Student Success"</i>	• Understand how data informs MTMDSS tiered decision-making within comprehensive school counseling programs to support students with diverse and multifaceted needs • Demonstrate the ability to analyze student data (e.g., attendance, behavior, and academic indicators) to identify trends, root causes, and equity gaps that guide intentional intervention planning • Apply data-driven strategies within the MTMDSS framework to design, implement, and evaluate targeted interventions that lead to positive, measurable student outcomes—and believe in the power of data-informed practice to drive equitable change for all students
