Dear Selection Committee:

I am writing to support the application of FULL NAME ("NICKNAME") for the XYZ position in your department. She was well-respected by her students who described her in end-of-term evaluations as "QUOTE FROM EVALUATION" and "SECOND QUOTE FROM EVALUATION."
