Master of Education (M.Ed.) Preliminary Multiple Subject Credential Program

The Department of Education Studies (EDS) at UC San Diego offers a Master of Education Degree and Credential Program for those seeking a California Preliminary Multiple Subject Credential for elementary school teachers. All EDS-credential programs provide preparation for teaching English language learners in a regular classroom setting.

The M.Ed./Credential program has four distinguishing features:

- Focus on equitable education practices
- Emphasis on the application of information technology and research-based practice
- Preparation of teachers to be reflective practitioners
- Preparation of new teachers to understand the process and standards associated with the National Board of Professional Teaching Standards Certification

M.Ed./Preliminary Multiple Subject Credential

The M.Ed./Preliminary Multiple Subject Credential Program consists of Educational Foundation courses, Professional Preparation courses, and the preparation of a Teaching Performance Assessment Portfolio. Upon completion of the Educational Foundation courses, students will be evaluated to determine their preparedness for continuation into the Professional Preparation Program.

This is a 13-month (mid-June to mid-July) program that begins in the summer. Students complete the Educational Foundations coursework in the first summer-intensive session and the Professional Preparation coursework during the remaining 10 months (end of August through mid-July.)

Students who have completed the Educational Foundations courses as UC San Diego undergraduates should apply to the 10-month graduate Professional Preparation Program.

M.Ed./Credential Multiple Subject Admission Requirements (MS1-Sum or MS2)

1. Bachelor's Degree from an Accredited Institution:

Any major of study equivalent or comparable to one offered in the UC System. A 3.0 cumulative GPA is required from the school awarding the degree.

2. Three Letters of Recommendation - DUE BY APPLICATION DEADLINE

3. Statement of Purpose - DUE BY APPLICATION DEADLINE

This should be a one-three page, single-spaced, typed essay focusing on the following three areas:

- A) Your reasons for choosing education as a career and for applying to Education Studies at UC San Diego.
- B) Your detailed experience working with students from various cultural backgrounds in the public schools and any related experience that you feel is appropriate (attach a general resume as well).
- C) Your community service experiences, especially those in culturally diverse settings.

4. Subject Matter Competence Requirement - DUE BY APPLICATION DEADLINE

This requirement can be fulfilled by providing evidence of satisfactory completion of the California Subject Examination for Teachers (CSET). You must pass all required Multiple Subject CSET 3 subtests (101, 214, and 103 or its equivalent after 8/1/22: 225). Official Score Report required.

OR a Subject Matter Preparation Program (SMPP). EDS does not offer a SMPP for Multiple Subject, but will accept it from other accredited institutions (¾ complete by the application deadline - 100% complete by the start of the program).

OR can be satisfied by Degree Major, which must include the exact words: **Liberal Studies**, or **Liberal Arts**, or **Elementary Education** in the title of the Degree (CTC notification) (none of these offered at UCSD).

5. Basic Skills Requirement - DUE BY APPLICATION DEADLINE (waiting for degree to be conferred is ok)

Candidates can use their bachelor's (or higher) degree earned at a regionally accredited college or university to meet the <u>Basic Skills Requirement (BSR)</u>. Verification of the conferral of a BA or BS degree will be required after orientation, if admitted into the program.

6. U.S. Constitution requirement - DUE BY APPLICATION DEADLINE

You may choose one of the following options to fulfill this requirement:

- A) A score of 3 or better on the AP U.S. History or AP U.S. Government and Politics exam. Official Score Report required.
- B) Completion of a course covering the principles of the U.S. Constitution. Please see EDS website for approved UCSD courses.
- C) Passage of an appropriate university-level exam. (e.g. UC San Diego Extension or Notre Dame de Namur University).
- D) Completion of a B.A./B.S. Degree from a California State University (CSU), which automatically fulfills this requirement.
- 7. Copy of a Negative TB Test: Must be taken within 60 days of orientation. You are required to show proof at orientation.

Bilingual Authorization Program (BILA)

A Bilingual Authorization Program (BILA) in **Spanish** is optional for M.Ed. graduate students who wish to teach in Spanish and English in a dual language or bilingual setting. It is NOT a credential program requirement. It is an authorization added to a Preliminary Multiple or Single Subject Subject Teaching Credential upon completion of all program credential requirements, plus the following:

- 1. EDS Core Courses Required (no substitutions allowed):
 - EDS 125 (History, Politics & Theory of Bilingual Education) Recommended to take during the foundations program of study, (EDS Major or Minor, or during the special summer session).
 - EDS 352A (Bilingual Instructional Practices I) during the Professional Preparation year only as a graduate student.
 - EDS 352B (Bilingual Instructional Practices II) during the Professional Preparation year only as a graduate student.
 - EDS 352C (Bilingual Instructional Practices III) during the Professional Preparation year only as a graduate student
- Demonstration of proficiency in Spanish (reading, writing, listening and speaking) at the level required by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CTC) through course-embedded assignments (EDS 352ABC), OR through passage of CSET: Spanish Subtest III (test code 147).
- 3. Satisfactory completion of fieldwork in a bilingual setting as required by CTC (to be completed as part of EDS 369ABC).

EDS Minor: Option 2 - Multiple Subject Educational Foundations [Year 1]

UC San Diego students planning to apply to the EDS graduate M.Ed./Preliminary Multiple Subject Credential Program must complete all requirements listed below. (Note: Admission to EDS graduate program is not guaranteed for EDS minors).

- The requirements must include at least 30 units, including at least 20 upper-division units.
- Course overlaps with majors: Unlimited lower-division courses; maximum of two upper-division courses.
- Students may not minor in Education Studies and major in Education Sciences.
- All Foundations courses used towards the graduate program (with the exception of EDS 139) must be taken for a letter grade.
- A minimum 3.0 GPA for all Educational Foundations coursework is required for advancement to the Professional Preparation coursework.
- Students interested in the graduate program who have not completed the minor must apply to the MS1–Multiple Subject Summer Intensive Program (with defined coursework).

Course of Study for the M.Ed./Preliminary Multiple Subject Credential Professional Preparation [Year 2]

Advancement to Master's/Preliminary Multiple Subject Credential Professional Coursework:

Upon successful completion of the Educational Foundations coursework completed during the summer intensive, students are evaluated to determine their preparation and fitness for continuation into the Professional Preparation coursework and student teaching. The EDS faculty committee makes decisions concerning student continuation of the program based on the completion of all requirements, academic achievement, and level of professionalism in all aspects of the program. Continuation into the professional year is not automatic.

Course of Study

Once selected for advancement, the M.Ed./Preliminary Multiple Subject Credential students complete the following Professional Preparation coursework. All courses must be taken for a **LETTER grade**, except for Student Teaching *Practicum* (EDS 369A/B/C).

All Multiple Subject credential candidates are required to meet the RICA requirement as of October 1, 1998.
