

Ultra Gradebook Truncates Grade Display

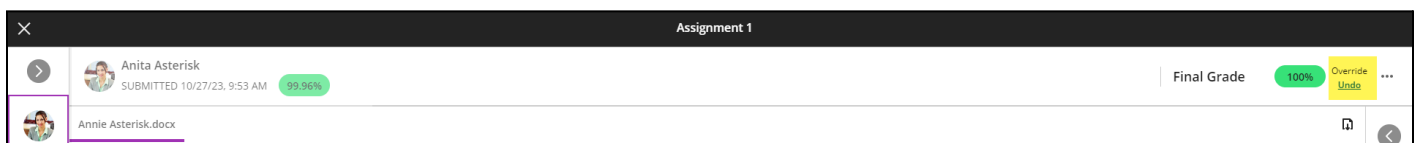
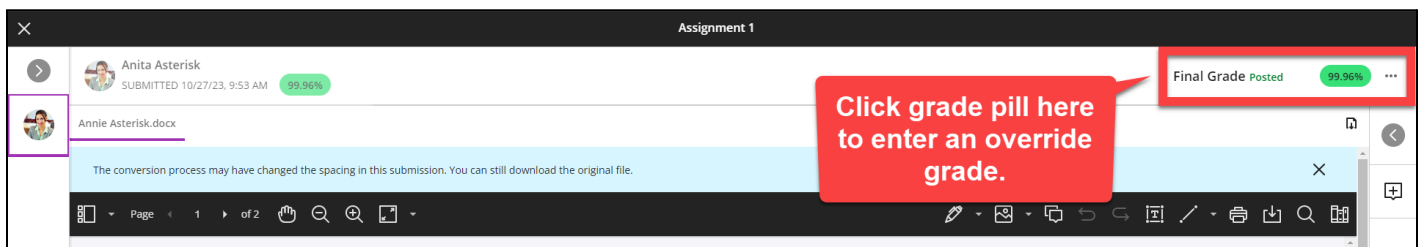
Blackboard Ultra - Known Issue

Anthology's product manager confirms that Ultra truncates grade values after two decimal points rather than rounding up. For example, if a student scores 89.99980% on a test, Ultra will display 89.99% instead of 90.00%. Anthology states that this is functioning as designed in order to prevent rounding errors in calculated columns.

If you feel that a grade should be rounded up, you may [assign a manual override score](#).

Assigning an Override Grade to an Assessment

When viewing the student's assessment attempt, locate the "Final Grade" grade pill towards the right side of the page. Click on the grade pill, type a new grade value in the field that appears, and then click away from the grade pill. The override grade will appear on the screen. You will see the word "override" next to the score as well as a link to undo the override if desired.



Assigning an Override Grade to an Overall Grade

You may assign an override grade to the score that appears in the Overall Grade column by clicking on the grade pill, typing in a new value, and clicking away from the grade pill.

When an override grade is assigned to the Overall Grade column, the pill will appear in gray.
