THEATRE 1: INTRO TO THEATRE <u>Prerequisite:</u> None	AR0101	9-12	SEM	0.5 FA per sem.
Students learn theatre basics about performance, including how to strongly perform vocally and physically; theatre vocabulary; techniques to conquer stage fright; and how a script goes from the page to the stage. The class culminates in a monologue from a film requiring strong imagination, performance technique, and technical/design elements such as props and costumes. No audition required.				
THEATRE 2: INTERMEDIATE THEATRE <u>Prerequisite:</u> Drama 1 and consent of instructor	AR0201	10-12	YEAR	0.5 FA per sem.
Students build on skills learned in Theatre 1: how to audition, how to polish vocal and physical technique, but also full units on dramatic analysis through film, design, and musical theatre. The final for the year involves a musical theatre study that culminates in students utilizing any of the skills they've developed from Theatre 1 and 2 to create components for a new musical. By audition.				
MUSICAL THEATRE <u>Prerequisite:</u> Drama 1 and consent of instructor		11-12	YEAR	0.5 FA per sem.
This course will introduce students to the fundamentals of musical theatre, including singing, acting, and dance, as well as the history and background of several key musicals.				
THEATRE 3: ADVANCED THEATRE <u>Prerequisite:</u> Drama 2 and consent of instructor	AR0301	11-12	YEAR	0.5 FA per sem.
Students continue to build on skills developed in Theatre 1 and 2, with more of an emphasis on production and student leadership. Students create their own pieces, solo and in groups, and design them using lights, sound effects, video projections, costumes, props, and scenery. There is a director's study and a playwriting study, and the year culminates in a student written, directed, and designed one act play festival. By audition.				
THEATRE 4: ADVANCED THEATRE <u>Prerequisite:</u> Drama 3 and consent of instructor	AR0350	12	YEAR	0.5 FA per sem.
