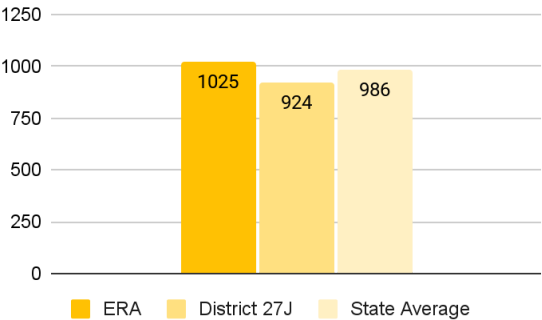
Starting with the class of 2021, students must meet credit requirements for ERA and complete at least one option from Column A and one from Column B to show college and career readiness.

Alternatively, students can choose Option 5, a capstone project focused on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) that includes an English component. This project is documented through a portfolio and other formats.

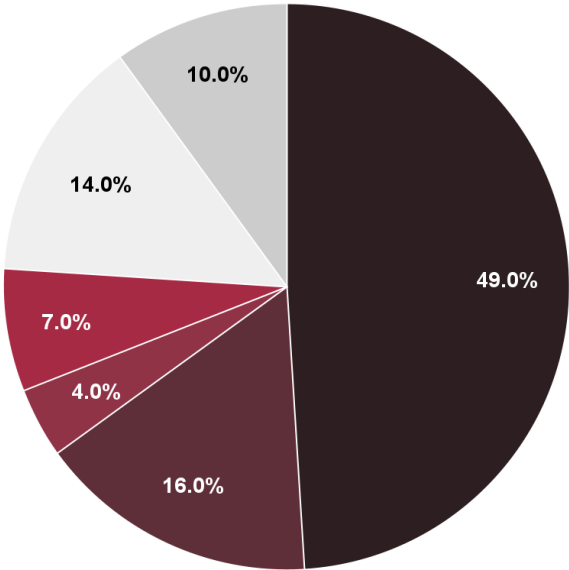
Class of 2025 SAT Statistics
