Graduates receive a **Certificate in Group Breathwork Facilitation**, aligned with ABA standards – ready to expand both your inner depth and your professional scope.

Vision and spirit of the training

Breathwork has demonstrated profound transformative potential in both personal and clinical contexts, and we have witnessed this again and again in our Breathwork program in a trauma recovery unit over the last 5 years. Mental health professionals and Breathwork practitioners are increasingly drawn to the capacity of this modality to build connection, resilience, and embodied awareness.

This training offers a **structured**, **supportive**, **and ethically grounded pathway** for practitioners to step confidently into group facilitation. It nurtures professional skills while guiding participants to hold **safe**, **trauma-informed**, **and compassionate spaces** during Breathwork sessions in group settings.

The Training becomes a medium for **self-awareness**, **relational depth**, **and community building**, integrating contemporary understandings of trauma, embodiment, and relational

ethics. Participants will leave equipped to facilitate groups with integrity, confidence, and care, responding to the rising need for skilled Breathwork facilitation in professional and clinical settings.

Program overview

• **Format:** Combination of Zoom theory sessions + in-person 3-day retreats + clinical practicum

• **Duration:** January–May 2026

• Commitment: 80–90 hours

• Venues: Port Sorell (Lutruwita / Tasmania) | Rivendell Hospital (Burnie) | Zoom

• **Group size:** Limited to 9 participants for close mentorship and supervision

		Session 4: Reflective practice – feedback methods, supervision, and self-awareness

• Zoom sessions are arranged as follows: 2 before the first retreat, 2 in between the retreat, and 1 after the final retreat, allowing participants to absorb theory while

exercises to consolidate learning and track skill

practicing, and to integrate learning gradually

- In-person retreats are immersive and **hands-on**, giving participants confidence before entering the clinical practicum
- Practicum is flexible (2–4 days) to accommodate clinical schedules and ensure practical experience in a supportive setting

Participant requirements

- Minimum 2 years of personal Breathwork practice
- Completion of ABA-recognised practitioner training
- Commitment to ethical, trauma-informed practice
- Willingness to engage in professional reflection and supervision

Applicants without formal endorsed ABA qualifications may be considered based on equivalent training and readiness, following an interview.

Emotional readiness and professional focus

This training is designed for practitioners ready to **deepen facilitation skills**, not for personal therapeutic processing. While emotional awareness is integral to Breathwork, the focus is on **holding safe and ethical group spaces**, rather than processing personal trauma.

Participants are expected to have sufficient personal stability and support systems. If personal content arises during the training, participants are expected to **set aside time for personal therapeutic processes outside the training hours.** Private therapeutic support is encouraged for deeper personal material arising during the training.
