







# PAAC GLOBAL ISSUES CERTIFICATE

Certified by the United Nations CIFAL Honolulu Center at Chaminade University and the United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR)

The Global Issues Certificate recognizes individual Hawaiʻi high school students who have expanded their understanding of global issues and international affairs to a degree worthy of recognition through active participation in PAAC's extracurricular High School Global Education Program.

## **Objectives**

- 1) Gain an understanding of the breadth of issues that have a global connection through examining local, global, and intercultural issues related to implementing the <u>United Nations Sustainable Development Goals</u> and the local, Hawai'i framework, the <u>Aloha Plus Challenge</u>.
- 2) Examine local and global issues from multiple perspectives.
- 3) Be able to research and analyze global components of issues of interest to students while seeking to understand and appreciate the perspectives and world views of others.
- 4) Develop an awareness of how various actors including government, businesses, civil society, international institutions, non-government organizations, individuals, and others can contribute in different ways towards achieving the Sustainable Development Goals.
- 5) Research, develop, and implement a service project that responds to a global issue.
  - a) Take action for collective well-being and sustainable development.
- 6) Communicate their learnings in open, appropriate, and effective interactions across cultures.

## **Required Components**

- Complete seven of the PAAC <u>UN SDG Curriculum Suite lessons</u>

- Participate in one <u>Academic WorldQuest Competition</u>

- Develop a Global Action Project that explores one of the UN SDGs they have studied

- Submit the Global Issues Certificate Application after completing all requirements

- Free and open to all Hawai'i high school students
- All requirements must be completed before the student graduates from high school
- Only one certificate per student
- Students keep track of their own progress
- Students can complete this <u>intent form</u> to start the process. The intent form helps
  PAAC know who is working on the certificate and allows us to follow up with students on their progress.
- <u>Use this timeline</u> to consider how long this process will take for you.
- **OPTIONAL**: <u>Use this template</u> to organize your written reflections
- After a student submits the <u>Global Issues Certificate Application</u>, PAAC will confirm all requirements have been met and issue the certificate.
